New Informed Consent Policy

- 1) VHA Handbook 1004.1, "Informed Consent for Treatments and Procedures," has been revised. The new version is now available from the National Center for Ethics in Health Care at: www.va.gov/vhaethics/download/ICpolicy.doc
- 2) The new policy was developed with the help of many individuals and offices throughout VHA. The policy development process involved:
 - researching relevant statutory requirements and case law
 - conducting an extensive review of the published literature
 - convening a working group of representatives from VACO and the field
 - examining existing facility and VISN policies to identify best practices
 - reviewing the Center's records for related consultation requests
 - issuing a call for written comments from the field
 - analyzing nearly 1,000 comments on multiple drafts
 - discussing aspects of the policy on scheduled national teleconferences
 - obtaining formal concurrence from multiple VACO offices.
- 3) The National Center for Ethics in Health Care will be sponsoring several educational events relating to the new policy, including a national ethics teleconference from 1:00-2:00pm EST on February 10 (see http://vaww.va.gov/vhaethics/networking-6.cfm) and a live national satellite broadcast on February 27.
