

New Commissary Update:

Officials Break Ground on Moon Military Commissary - August 17, 2012

Construction will soon be under way on a University Boulevard military commissary, marking the end of a six-year battle to bring the facility to Moon.





Officials break ground on the 43,000 square-foot post, Friday, August 17, 2012. Sen. Bob Casey, Reps. Tim Murphy, Mike Doyle, Jason Altmire and Mark Critz, and Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald each spoke at the ceremony.

Sen. Bob Casey, D-Scranton, said it was a testament to perseverance.

Members of Pennsylvania's Congressional delegation and military officials from across the region attended the ground-breaking ceremony for the long-awaited Moon Township military commissary last week.

The 43,000 square-foot facility, set to open in the fall of 2013, will house a grocery story for more than 170,000 military members and their families in Pennsylvania, Ohio and West Virginia.

The regional hub will be located at the corner of University Boulevard and the Interstate 376 Business Route in Moon and will more than double the size of Oakdale's Charles E. Kelly Commissary, which is slated to close.

The effort to bring the new commissary to Moon has been in the works since

2005, when the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Commission targeted the Oakdale commissary for closure.

Officials at the event described years-worth of bureaucratic hurdles that often stalled the project from coming to fruition.

The Defense Commissary Agency in 2008 gave initial approval for the Moon commissary project, but construction was delayed while additional funds were secured for construction.

In December 2011, the state's Congressional delegation announced that more than \$17 million in federal funding was freed for the new post.

"Folks from Western Pennsylvania just don't know how to take no for an answer," said Rep. Mike Doyle, D-Forest Hills. "There are no Republicans and Democrats when we are working for our troops in Western Pennsylvania."

Earlier this summer the Mississippi-based Carothers Construction was awarded a \$12 million contract to serve as the prime contractor on the project.

The commissary, which will sit directly in front of the U.S. Army Reserve base off Soldiers Lane, will mark the latest addition to Moon Township's military community. A \$10 million Naval Operations Support Center is slated to open in 2014 on the grounds of the neighboring Air Force Reserve 911th Airlift Wing Base, also located off the Interstate 376 Business Route.

Rep. Tim Murphy, R-Upper St. Clair, Rep. Jason Altmire, D-McCandless, and Rep. Mark Critz, D-Johnstown, and Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald, were also on hand for the ground breaking.

Members of Congress often referenced the planned commissary while countering Defense Department efforts to shutter the 911th Airlift Wing earlier this year.

"We've got to keep that base open," Murphy told audience members at the ceremony. "We've seen huge levels of civilian support (for the 911th)."

"There's a lot of enthusiasm for this project," said Maj. Gen. William D.R. Waff, commanding General of the 99th Regional Support Command, who said having the commissary located in Moon Township could lead to increased use of the facility. "It's going to pull everybody back together."



This web site provides important information regarding your retirement pay. See print of main web site page below for all the information available to you.

Under "Latest News", please pay special attention to "Direct Deposit Required". A treasury mandate requires DFAS to pay their customers electronically beginning March 1, 2013. If you are currently being paid by paper checks you will have to set up a direct deposit. Please take action now because March will be here before you know it and you don't want your pay delayed.



Click on "Manage Your Retirement" (along the left border), then click on "Direct Deposit". The following is a snapshot of what you should see on your screen. Here you will see the three ways to enroll in direct deposit.



As shown on the screen shot above, there are three ways to enroll in direct deposit, (1) through myPay, (2) Mail or fax completed Direct Deposit Form FMS 2231, or (3) call Customer Service. The easiest and fastest way is myPay. If you never logged into myPay, follow the 7 step instructions on the next 3 pages. If you previously in myPay but forgot you Login ID and/or password

How to Create a New myPay Account

1. Click the "Forgot or Need a Password" link on the *myPay* homepage to request a temporary password.



2. Enter your Social Security Number and click the "Yes" button on the bottom right side of the page



3. Choose "mail to my address of record with Military Retired" and click the "Send me a Password" button. Your temporary password will be mailed to your address on record with Retired and Annuitant Pay. You should receive it in about 10 business days.



4. Once you receive your temporary password, return to the *myPay* homepage and click the "Create an Account" link.



5. Create your account by entering your Social Security Number and your temporary password and click the "Accept/Submit" button.



6. You will be prompted to create a Login ID and a permanent password.



7. Your Login ID and password are the keys to keeping your retired pay account current, so be sure to remember them!

Once you receive your temporary myPay password in the mail and login myPay to create your Login ID and permanent password you will come to the Main Menu in myPay. (see below)

Social Security Numbers Being Removed from New ID Cards

The Department of Defense (DoD) is in the process of removing Social Security numbers (SSNs) from uniformed services identification (ID) cards as part of the continued effort to protect the privacy and security of TRICARE's 9.6 million beneficiaries. SSNs are being replaced with a DoD Benefits Number. This process is expected to last several years, until all current uniformed services ID cards are replaced as they come up for renewal.

Note: You do not need to make a special trip to have your ID card updated until it expires. Your health care providers and pharmacists will be able to access your benefits using either your SSN or your DoD Benefits Number. The new 11-digit DoD Benefits Number can be found above the bar code on the back of your ID card. This number is a unique number, like your SSN, and it will ensure that your records are clearly aligned with you and your treatments. If you have questions, please visit www.tricare.mil/ssn.

ID Cards: Appointments are required for new ID Cards. Walk-in service is no longer accepted. You can schedule your appointment by calling (412) 776-7485 or online by going to the 171st Air Refueling Wing web page http://www.171arw.ang.af.mil/. Select "ID Card Appointment Scheduler" under the heading titled "Featured Links" located under the right hand column of the home page. Next you will select 'Make an Appointment' located on the top blue bar, select your state (PA) then hit GO, select your city (CORAOPOLIS) then click NEXT, then select the Coraopolis location. You are now ready to schedule your appointment by selecting the month and day. Select one of the available times listed. Read the instructions and provide the required information, then click on 'SUBMIT'. You will receive a confirmation email for your appointment.
