Finding geographic names in the U.S. Board of Geographic Names databases, http://geonames.usgs.gov/

- listed under "Other Links" on the USGS Libraries Program web site, http://library.usgs.gov
 - (1) Domestic Names (United States): http://gnis.usgs.gov/domestic/index.html
 - Search feature name = mountain; in State = New York
 - Click "Send Query"
 - Be patient; and the query results in 1,547 entries, may want to limit by county
 - Select the first result, Painter Mountain; the reference information and map name is listed; we use this when someone has a feature (lake, mountain, etc.) and they are looking for the elevation, coordinates, and quad map name
 - Redo the search but limit to Essex County, New York
 - Click "Send Query"
 - (2) Domestic Names (United States): http://gnis.usgs.gov/domestic/index.html
 - Search feature name = mountain: in State = Colorado : and select Feature Class = Summit
 - Click "Send Query"
 - This search is limiting to only "mountain" names that are summits (i.e. mountain peaks), and there are 1,345
 - Click on the link for Lookout Mountain; note there are three variant names, and the citations are included
 - (3) Citizens can request name changes; for example click on the "Propose or Change a Name" from the link at: http://gnis.usgs.gov/domestic/index.html
 - To view the status of proposed names, click on the "Quarterly Review List" from the link at: http://gnis.usgs.gov/domestic/index.html
 - (4) Foreign Names: http://gnis.usgs.gov/foreign/index.html
 - Use the NGA GEOnet Names Server (GNS): http://earth-info.nga.mil/gns/html/index.html
 - This is useful for research geologists working in foreign countries; use the "Download Country Files" on the left to use as search terms for research.
