(Or, do you hold with the stupid and ridiculous conclusion of the Report From Iron Mountain on the Possibilities of Peace?

Whether you wish to face it or not Mr. Nixon, people are weary with the lousy morality of this country, and the lousy way it has treated other nations of this world. Get going and do something about it, quit the onslaught of vacuous rhetoric and be a good Quaker instead of a phoney.

Even if you change, I won't vote for you. You need to atone for a lousy outlook on life.
