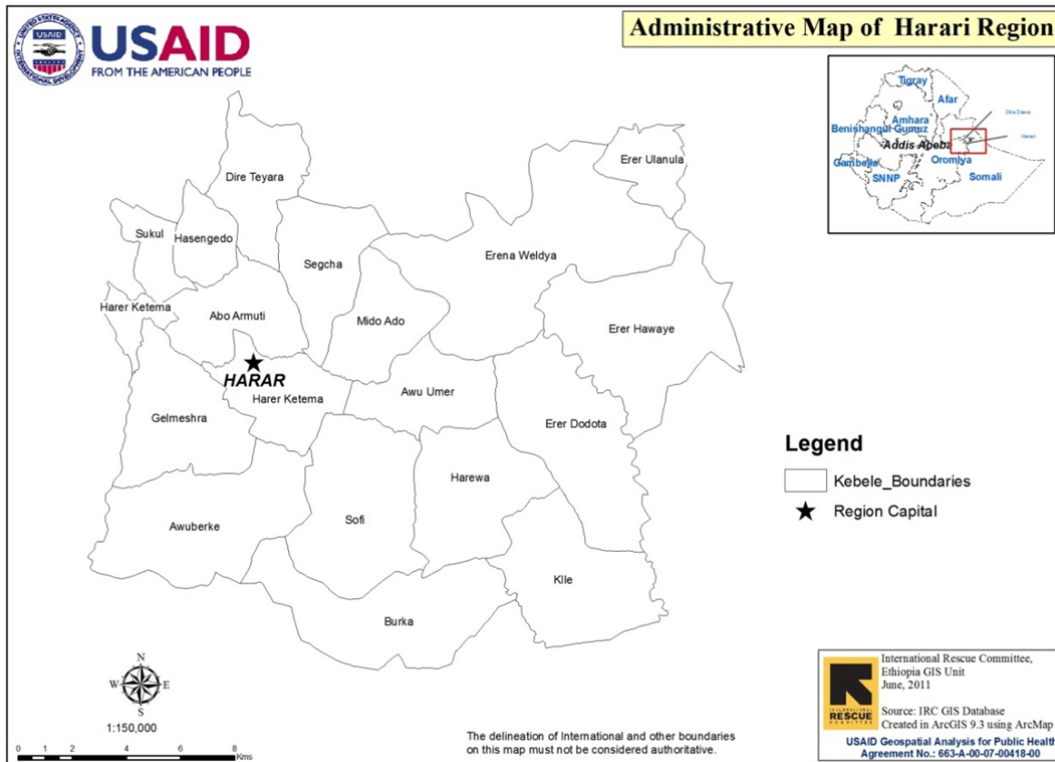




SUPPORT FOR THE HARARI REGION
