2 March 1986	Mr. Fred Cone, Assistant Base Maintenance Officer, was reassigned to the Public Works Division for duty as the Director of Design.
3 March 1986	Expansion of Courthouse Bay Water and Wastewater treatment plants was completed. This project increased the capacity of the Water Treatment Plant from 600,000 gal/day to 800,000 gal/day and the Wastewater Treatment Plant from 525,000 gal/day to 600,000 gal/day.
15 April 1986	Due to the hiring freeze on civilian personnel and strict ceiling constraints, 31 temporary employees were released to bring the onboard personnel strength to the Letter of Allowance (LOA) figure of 760.
19 May 1986	Colonel M. G. Lilley assumed duties of Base Maintenance Officer. Lieutenant Colonel W. M. Rice was reassigned duties as the Assistant Base Maintenance Officer.
03 June 1986	The Marine Corps Inspector General's inspection was conducted 3 June through 16 June 1986. The grades for the functional areas inspected were: Maintenance and Operations of Facilities - AA Utilities Management - XN Energy Conversion - AA Pest Control Program - AA Additionally, two Base Maintenance civilian employees received the only two commendation for outstanding work awarded to Marine Corps Base civilians during the IG Inspection. Betty Geary and Debra Woods received the tribute.
18 June 1986	A contract to repair the precipitators located at the Central Heating Plant was awarded, with work to begin within 60 days.
21 July 1986	An Emergency Shop was established at the French Creek area, Bldg FC 301, to improve customer response and mapport in the area.
21 July 1986	The Emergency Shop at the Marine Corps Air Station, New River was expanded to a maintenance detachment to reduce travel time and increase productivity.



23 July 1986	Maintenance shop forces in conjunction with contract workers began plans for renovation of the Officers Club Building 2615.
31 July 1986	Lieutenant Colonel W. M. Rice departed Camp Lejeune, North Carolina on transfer orders for permanent change of station.
4 August 1986	Mr. Clifford Powell, Assistant Base Maintenance Officer, reported in from Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.
15 September 1986	Base Maintenance's stand alone computer system achieved the capability to generate reports relevant to specific job orders such as Job Order status by building priority, age, work request number and customer ID.
30 September 1986	Financial close-out of FY-86 saw a total budget to actual expense variance of only 5%. Year end backlog of Maintenance and Repair was in excess of \$50,000,000.
01 October 1986	Historical workload data collection commenced for use in the Commercial Activities Review.
01 October 1986	With CMC approval, the method of accomplishing work effort requiring between 17 and 80 manhours labor was expanded. A service ticket can now be issued to cover work effort of \$2,000 for material and labor or 80 manhours, whichever occurs first.
14-24 October 1986	BMO, ABMO, CA Team members, and BOSMAD representatives met with individual shops to brief and discuss the ongoing Commercial Activities Review and several procedural changes.
16-17 October 1986	Six employees attended the two day Hazardous Waste Facilities Manager Course conducted at Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point.
27 October 1986	The Navy Audit Service commenced a supply audit of Base Maintenance and Direct Stock Support Control. It is ongoing and is a simultaneous audit of Camp Pendelton and Camp Lejeune. Results are pending audit completion.



31 October 1986

Because service work classification thresholds were raised, preventative and cyclic maintenance efforts were being accomplished via service calls, and utilities maintenance efforts were "called up" by service chits. 13,771 service work tickets were generated during the month of October by the Base Maintenance Work Reception Section as compared to 4,590 tickets generaged during the peak month of October 1985.

Sixty-four construction contracts worth over 17 million dollars were awarded for Camp Lejeune. Construction was completed on another 67 contracts totaling almost 21 million dollars. Significant projects were two railroad repair projects costing almost 12 million dollars; a half-million dollar project to widen Holcomb Boulevard: repairing Riseley Pier (\$418,880); water and sewer improvements in the Midway Park housing area (\$474,103); and resurfacing the streets in the Tarawa Terrace and Paradise Point housing areas (\$1,316,000).

The expansion of Holcomb Boulevard Water Treatment Plant contract was awarded to Harry Pepper and Associates for \$7,092,989.76. Contract completion date is 16 January 1987. This contract will expand the treatment capacity of the Holcomb Boulevard Water Treatment Plant (Building 670) from 2,000,000 gallons per day to 5,000,000 gallons per day. Upon contract completion, Building 670 will supply treated water to the Tarawa Terrace areas, the Camp Johnson areas, Knox Trailer Park and the areas presently served. A 24" treated water main will also be installed connecting Building 670 to the Hadnot Point Water Plant (Building 20). This will allow system to system transfer of treated water during emergencies.

20 January 1985

Temperatures dropped to a reported low of 8° on 20 January and 0° on 21 January 1985. Command Chronologies are permanent records and will provide a concise review of the experiences of the Command. All significant programs and policy decisions adopted or implemented should be discussed. Changes in facilities, acquisition of new equipment, tests of equipment or doctrine, contributions to the evolution of doctrine, and problem areas should be covered. Sufficient detail must be included to convey the unique and distinctive qualities of the Command during the reporting period covered.
- 2. Submissions are compiled into a single document by the Assistant Chief of Staff, Training. Chronologies will be typed on plain bond paper, free of typographical, grammatical and format errors, using a pica style type. No page number or enclosure designations will be used. Enclosure (2) will serve as a checklist to prevent many of the common errors made in Chronology submissions.
- 3. Only organizational submissions will use the format contained in Appendix C of the reference. Enclosure (3) is a copy of a Chronology submitted in proper format. Staff sections will use the format contained in enclosure (4).
- 4. The original ribbon typed Command Chronology should reach this Headquarters (Attn: AC/S, Training) no later than 31 January 1983.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Command, Operations, and Training

Infantry Training School continued to perform its mission of providing intensive training to basic 0300 Marines in those weapons

Student Personnel

the second secon and combat skills necessary to produce infantrymen who are highly disciplined, physically fit, and capable of closing with and destroying or capturing the enemy as part of a combat unit. The four courses of instruction within the Infantry Entry Level Skills Training syllabus were reviewed and modified as necessary in order to present superior instruction to students undergoing training.

Major emphasis in course review and analysis was placed on the Periods of Instruction (POIs) for MOS 0311, 0331, 0341, and 0351. All POIs reflect the standards set forth in MCO 1510.35 (Infantry Training Standards). Tasks analysis were conducted and incorporated into a new training schedule. The emphasis of the new schedule was to eliminate "dead-time" or non-productive waiting time. Additionally, emphasis was placed on incorporating the weapons MOSs in combined training with the 0311 MOS. This was done to increase the tactical knowledge necessary for weapons students, and add more realism to the training as a whole. Combined MOS Training highlights include a live fire single envelopment supported by the machine gun section, defensive tactics and patrolling for all MOSs except MOS 0341, and a two day "war" including Mechanized Assault, Combat in a Built-up Area, Vertical Assault, Squad Operations, Final Protective Fires FFEX, Night Patrolling, M72A2 LAAW FFEX, and Squad level infiltration for approximately four miles.

Concurrent with the development and implementation of the Training Schedules and ITS Task Analysis, two groups of Reserve SeaBees received their two week Active Duty Training. RCNF-1 consisting of approximately 250 officers and men received instruction in three MOSs; 0311, 0331, and 0341.


Course syllabus for SeaBee 0311 consisted of FAM firing the M16Al service rifle, Combat Firing Positions, Techniques of Day and Night firing, Offensive Tactics, Defensive Tactics, Patrolling, and Helicopter Indoctrination.

Course syllabus for SeaBee 0331 consisted of FAM firing the M60 machine gun, General and Detailed Disassembly, Nomenclature, Function and Malfunctions, Field Firing Exercise Qualification fires, Defensive Tactics, Patrolling, and Helicopter Indoctrination.

Course syllabus for SeaBee 0341 consisted of the M51 Sight, 81mm Mortar Nomenclature, Crew Drill, Indirect and Direct Lay, Gunners Qualification, Field Firing Exercise, and Helicopter Indoctrination.

The second Reserve unit was a composite unit consisting of 50 SeaBee Instructors from the continental United States. Course syllabus consisted of M60 machine gun review and FFEX, M29Al 81mm mortar review and FFEX, M16Al service rifle FAM fire, Combat Firing Positions, Offensive and Defensive Tactics, M1911Al 45 cal pistol FAM fire, Patrolling, and Techniques of Military Instruction.

From March through June 1982, 600 ROTC and JROTC students representing sixteen high schools and colleges received a one day



introduction course. Course syllabus consisted of an Introduction to the Marine Corps, Battalion Weapons Demonstration, M16A1 service rifle and M60 machine gun FAM fire, Patrolling, and Assault Course Training.

Emphasis was placed upon the physical abilities of Marine students at the Infantry Training School. This included the upkeep and up-grade of existing courses such as the Assault Course and Endurance Course, however additional courses were designed and implemented such as the Circuit Course, Upper Body Strength Course, and a Combat Fitness Center designed to build body strength through a medium of weight lifting. The arrival of weight lifting equipment is not scheduled until 26 July 1982, but the Instructors, Lesson Plans, and the restructured buildings have been prepared to incorporate this course into the training syllabus. In addition, a Practical Examination has been devised. Developed in conjunction with the Combat Training Center is a three mile running course consisting of various stations, to include two firing stations, where the student must demonstrate his proficiency in various military skills. The test is timed and is an evaluation of the students' physical endurance, mental discipline, and reaction under stressful situations. The test was designed to incorporate the tasks set forth by MCO 1510.35 in the General Subjects section.

In the summer of 1982, the M47 Dragon is scheduled to arrive at the Infantry Training School. Lesson Plans, Instructors, Class-rooms, Ranges, and Collateral Equipment have been prepared or requested to incorporate the M47 into the training syllabus.

Barracks Marine quotas are being assigned to the Infantry Training School for the first time. Schedule adjustments were made to allow for the training, logistical support, and uniform fitting of approximately 1200 additional Marines.


Future projects for the Infantry Training School include the implementation of the POI for the Dragon gunners, the training of Devil Pups (Young Marines), the hosting of the Bermuda Regiment, and refresher and new equipment training of the 2d Marine Division and 2d Force Service Support Group personnel in the functioning of the new light weight 60mm Mortar and M19 machine gun.

During this chronology period, Infantry Training School selected Gunnery Sergeant Robert MCHENRY Jr. as the Instructor of the Quarter for the first quarter of calendar year 1982 and Gunnery Sergeant Jimmy R. THORNE as the Instructor of the Quarter for the second quarter of calendar year 1982.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Command, Operations, and Training


The primary operational and training emphasis from 1 July to 31 December 1981 was the continuation of improvement in the programs of instruction (POI's) for the twenty-six formal courses taught at Marine Corps Engineer School (MCES). In this regard, MCES has completed 9 POI's and submitted them for review and approval to the Commanding General, Marine Corps Education and Development Center (Code E03). MCDEC approved 4 courses for implementation.

This period was also marked by the further implementation of MCO 5400.42. In this regard, MCDEC (Code E03) made an on-site visit to discuss its order MCDECO P1553.1 and a survey/study/question-answer session concerning MCES's POIs. As a result of this visit, MCES has greatly increased its knowledge of course development and has made vast progress in updating all course material.

In terms of academic support, MCES developed and upgraded its proposed training aids package. The package emphasized state-of-the-art hardware and culminated with a study on a 5.1 million dollar simulation device acquisition, which was submitted to HOMC for inclusion in the POM-84 initiative. Closer relationship was also established with the Regional Training and Audio Visual Support Center (TAVSC), Camp Lejeune.

-During this chronology period, MCES selected Staff Sergeant Danny L. KNIGHT as Instructor of the Quarter for the second quarter of calendar year 1981 and Gunnery Sergeant Walter J. RICHARDS as Instructor of the Quarter for the third quarter. Competition for this quarterly award is always keen and serves to promote academic excellence.

Aside from academic matters, MCES received a series of Management Evaluation Program (MEP) Inspections by Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune. The MEP inspections covered 29 functional areas which resulted in 9 rating of outstanding, 12 of excellent, and 8 of above average.
