of Unregulated Synthetic Organic  
Chemical Monitoring Results

Dear Sir:

Section .1638 of the "Rules Governing Public Water Supplies" requires that monitoring for the thirty-six (36) unregulated synthetic organic chemicals for systems serving populations between 3,300 and 10,000 persons begin no later than the quarter beginning January 1, 1989.

The rules further state in section .1640(d) that the water supplier shall notify persons served by the system of the availability of the results of sampling by including a notice in the first set of water bills issued after the receipt of the results by written notice within three (3) months, or by newspaper if the circulation of the newspaper adequately covers the consumers of the water system. The notice shall identify a person and telephone number to contact for information on the monitoring results. A copy of a model notice is enclosed to assist you in preparing one for your system. It is your responsibility to submit a copy of the notice to this office. All systems serving populations between 3,300 and 10,000 must notify their customers and send a copy of the notice to this office.

If your system has failed to have these analyses performed, you must do so immediately and notify all your customers in writing of this failure. It is the water system owner's responsibility to ensure that the analyses are completed properly. If you contract with a laboratory for the analyses, you should follow up to make sure the samples are collected in the proper calendar quarters. If samples are not collected and analyzed during consecutive calendar quarters for systems with surface sources, the series must be started over again and customer notification provided.
