MERIT SYSTEMS PROTECTION BOARD (MSPB) FACT SHEET

Employees Who May Appeal to the MSPB

Generally, employees who may appeal adverse actions and performance-based actions are those in the competitive service who have completed a probationary period. Probationary employees have limited appeal rights.

You may pursue a discrimination complaint under the MSPB appeal procedure without using the federal sector Equal Employment Opportunity complaint process. The case which contains a personnel action and also alleges the action was discriminatory - may be appealed to MSPB. **Some types of agency adverse actions that may be appealed to the Board include:** <u>removals, suspension for more than 14 days, reductions in pay or</u> <u>grade and furloughs of 30 days or less.</u>.

The time limit for appeal to the MSPB is <u>30 calendar days</u> after the effective date of the personnel action that you believe to be discriminatory in nature. Under such an appeal, you are entitled to a hearing by the MSPB. In addition, you may petition the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) to review the final decision of the MSPB on the allegation(s) of discrimination.

<u>Where to File an Appeal:</u> Generally, you must file your appeal with the Board's regional or field office that is responsible for your geographic area. A listing of addresses or MSPB regional and field offices is available on the MSPB Website at <u>www.mspb.gov</u>
