Headquarters ANG Title 10 2-4 years Statutory Tour at **NGB/SG (Joint Base Andrews, MD)**. Must be Air Force Specialty Code (AFSC) **4E071/91**. Duties and Responsibilities: Incumbent develops, interprets and/or implements ANG, USAF, DoD (Joint Force), Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), Food and Drug Administration (FDA), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Department of Homeland Security (HLS) policies and guidelines for occupational, deployment and community health. Interfaces with HQ USAF, MAJCOMS, state and federal agencies on policy matters which impact these areas. Will work full time in the development, interpretation, and implementation of public health and medical readiness policies and programs throughout the ANG; will coordinate activities with Air and Joint Staffs, MAJCOMs, federal, state, and other public agencies. Apply occupational health and epidemiological techniques and skills to ensure compliance with federal, state and local standards to reduce illness, injury, disability and premature death throughout the ANG while enhancing force health protection and readiness. Collaborates with Bioenvironmental Engineering and other SG teams, as required. Responsible to the Director, Air National Guard (ANG) for the medical readiness of all ANG warfighters and Expeditionary Combat Support to meet mission requirements. Ensures the medical response capability of the ANG Medical Service (ANGMS) to support all missions. Develops policy, plans, programs, budgets, trains, and deploys the men and women of 89 medical groups, ensuring seamless/synergistic fit into Total/Joint Force. Serves as the Career Field Manager for ANG Public Health. Working knowledge is mandatory in: public, community and international health; environmental health; occupational health; preventive medicine; nuclear, biological and chemical (NBC) defense; patient, food safety and vulnerability; equipment/personnel decontamination; biology; chemistry; anatomy; vaccination consultant; physiology; fundamental epidemiology and biostatistics; toxicology; laboratory techniques; sanitation and hygiene; bacteriology; aseptic techniques; medical entomology; Aeromedical Services Information Management System (ASIMS) ; written and oral communication and instruction.

Mandatory criteria as indicated in the MVA must be documented on the members report on individual personnel (RIP). If it is not indicated on the RIP, it is incumbent upon the applicant to ensure that the appropriate source documentation is provided with the application.

Must meet the above stated grade/rank requirement by closeout date of advertisement.

Member must have a Secret Clearance or an open investigation to apply for statutory tour positions.

Any MVA to an overseas location will require additional screening for the selectee and family prior to orders publication.

Enlisted applicants who are higher grade than the highest grade for the advertisement must provide a statement of understanding with the application stating he/she is willing to be voluntarily demoted if selected for this position, IAW ANGI 36-2503, Paragraph 3.8.

Members in a Special Duty Career Field (SDI)/Reporting Identifiers (RI) must submit a conditional release letter from your Functional Area Manager (FAM) stating you have fulfilled all obligations and will be released if selected for the position you are applying for. If selected for an MVA outside of the SDI (8XXX) or RDI (9XXX) you must have a fully qualified AFSC prior to accession onto Stat Tour AFSC(1XXX-7XXX)

Applications will be reviewed for qualification/disqualification only starting at 72 hours prior to closeout date. For example; an MVA closing out on the 10th of the month would be reviewed for qualified or disqualified only starting on the 7th of the month.

Application for this MVA signifies agreement to the following statement, "I certify that, to the best of my knowledge and belief, all of the information in and attached to this application is true, correct, complete and made in good faith. I understand that false or fraudulent information on or attached to this application may be grounds for rejection or for release from statutory tour after I begin work, and may be punishable by fine or imprisonment.
