

Detroit-Warren-Livonia, MI

- In 2011, the Detroit metropolitan area was the 4th largest export market in the United States, with merchandise shipments totaling \$49.4 billion. This is up \$5.5 billion (12.4 percent) from the \$44.0 billion in merchandise exported in 2010.
- The Detroit metropolitan area accounted for 70.7 percent of Michigan's merchandise exports in 2011.
- For the top 50 U.S. merchandise export destinations, Detroit ranks among the major metropolitan area exporters to Mexico (\$17.7 billion), Canada (\$16.2 billion), Saudi Arabia (\$3.0 billion), China (\$2.0 billion), and Venezuela (\$598 million).
- Detroit ranks among the major metropolitan area exporters of Transportation Equipment (\$32.4 billion), Machinery, Except Electrical (\$4.4 billion), Electrical Equipment, Appliances, and Component (\$2.0 billion), Fabricated Metal Products (\$1.6 billion), and Plastics and Rubber Products (\$1.2 billion).
- In 2011, Detroit benefited from existing trade agreements, exporting \$33.9 billion to the NAFTA region and \$192 million to the CAFTA-DR region.
- 68.5 percent of Detroit's merchandise exports go to NAFTA countries.
