

Marine Zoning and Regulatory Review

In response to requests by members of the public, shifting environmental concerning and threats in the Keys, better scientific information, and legal requirements, F Keys National Marine Sanctuary is conducting a review of sanctuary regulation including the rules and boundaries for marine zones in the sanctuary and surrou

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Florida Keys National Wildlife Refuges Complex, which co-manages 20 of the sanctuary's 27 Wildlife Management Are will also play a key role in the review while simultaneously updating its own

The review is an ongoing process, continuing into 2015. Comments on issues related to sanctuary boundaries, marine zones, the Key West and Great White Her National Wildlife Refuges, and associated regulations are being accepted through the Federal eRulemaking Portal www.regulations.gov (Docket Number NOAA-NOS-2012-0061) or by letter to the Sanctuary Superintendent or Refuge Manager.



Public Meetings


There will be a series of public meetings that start at 4 p.m. and end at 8:00 p.m., during which time staff will provide presentations about the zones and regulations, and accept public comments.




