The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Philadelphia District, announces the Proposed Plan for cleanup of radiological contamination at the DuPont Chambers Works Site

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Philadelphia District, is addressing radiological contamination in specific areas of the DuPont Chambers Works in Deepwater, New Jersey. In the 1940s, manufacturing operations for the federal government resulted in limited areas of soil and groundwater contamination. USACE is addressing site cleanup under the Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP). The public is invited to review and comment on the Proposed Plan and related documents. Preferred Cleanup Alternative: the recommended cleanup action or alternative is to 1) dig up or excavate impacted soil; 2) transport the soil to an offsite disposal facility; and 3) monitor the natural physical and chemical processes as they reduce contaminant concentrations in groundwater.
