Dear Mr. Reukauf:

This is in response to Ms. McMullen's email dated July 1, 2011, regarding the proposed action taken in the OSC File Number DI-11-1155. Your office requested a letter stating what action was proposed, and that such information would be included in your public file.

A proposed removal was given to the employee in OSC File Number DI-11-1155. This information is being disclosed to OSC from the employee's personnel records pursuant to trie law enforcement exception of the Privacy Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552a(b)(7). VA would not release this information to the public because the employee is considered to be a lower level employee whose privacy interests are outweighed by the public's need to know. See for example, <u>Hoyos v. United States</u>, No. 98-4178, slip op. at 3 (11<sup>th</sup> Cir., Feb. 1, 1999) and <u>Forest Service Employees for Environmental Ethics v. U.S. Forest Service</u>, 524 F.3d 1021 (9th Cir. 2008).

We acknowledge that the Privacy Act does not permit an agency which has properly disclosed information pursuant to an exception to control subsequent uses and disclosures by another agency. Accordingly, we object to this information being included in your public file, but concede that VA has no authority to require CSC to withhold it from the public.
