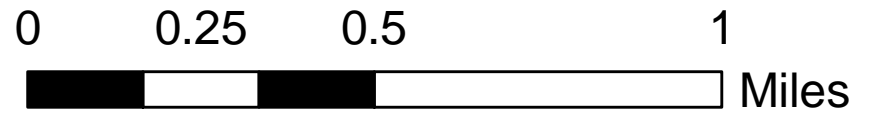
This map depicts USDA Forest Service Land Status Record data and the approximate location of the proposed conveyance parcels.
