## 2010 Alaska Region Marine Mammal Stranding Summary

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## **Summary**

Strandings of cetaceans and pinnipeds that occurred in Alaska waters and were reported to the National Marine Fisheries Service, Alaska Region (NMFS) in 2010 are summarized here. Polar bear, sea otter and walrus are managed under U.S. Fish and Wildlife jurisdiction and are not reported to NMFS. Currently a total of 220 events are recorded, involving 236 individual animals. These data are subject to change as more information becomes available and records are further reviewed. Both unconfirmed and confirmed reports are compiled here.

Stranding events include animals found dead (floating and beach-cast), and reports of live stranded, mass stranded, abandoned, sick or injured animals. Human interactions such as collisions, fishery interactions and entanglements are also included. Additionally, stranding events where the animal(s) could not be examined are included in the numbers below.

Known subsistence takes are not included, but suspected subsistence animals are in some cases included here (e.g., animals reported shot). Fishery observer reports are not included unless the animal was observed outside of statistical reporting protocols (and thus would not be included by the observer program as part of their watch data set).

Stranding events involving two or more individuals are generally rare in Alaska. However, in 2010 there were two separate reports of two bearded seal carcasses stranded together, two reports of cow and calf humpback whale entanglements, a report of two gray whales thrashing in the surf within a mile of each other, and two mass beluga strandings—one involving two animals and one involving 11 animals.
