- 3. Ability to work effectively with faculty and staff as well as other agencies in developing curriculum and standard operations procedures
- 4. Ability to understand and operate under the Incident Command System (ICS) and National Incident Management System (NIMS)

Education and/or Experience

Bachelor's degree is required in emergency management or a related field (business, social sciences, sport management, criminal justice or public administration). Two years related experience and/or training or equivalent combination of education and experience is also required.
