
HOTSPOTS that demand your full attention.

The first comes as you exit the Executive Beechcraft ramp taxiing north from Hangar 1. It is easy to confuse Taxiway **H**, the high speed exit off of Runway **19**, with Taxiway **G**, which is the northbound route to the approach end of Runway **21** or **19**.

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**00-02 MEETING:** Mr. Jim Terpstra, Jeppesen, presented a NTSB airport hot spot issue related to runway incursion to the ACF. These "hot spots" are areas on airfields where there has been an identified increased risk of runway incursion and/or taxi hazards.
