### **GPF - 1700 CUSTOMER SERVICE PROGRAM**

To purchase items that are needed to operate the Hoptel Unit on 6A, as well as to purchase items that will enhance our customer Service Program such as: Comfort Items for Hoptel Residents Newspaper Subscriptions for (ER, ADHC, DAV, PCG-1&2). Supplies for "Welcome Kits" which are given to each new admission. Bus Tokens for residents in need.

### **GPF - 1703 GERIATRIC EXTENDED CARE**

This account is primarily used to withdraw funds to provide for indigent patients regarding food, travel and lodging.

### **GPF - 1801 SOCIAL WORK SERVICE**

To purchase tokens/transportation and haircuts for indigent patients.

### **GPF - 1802 DAY TREATMENT CENTER**

To purchase items for use by veterans at the Day Treatment Center. These items may include but is not limited to tokens, food/beverages, tickets to activities within the community and transportation to these activities.

### **GPF - 1804 RECREATION FUND**

To support various patient recreational and diversional activities that are hosted by the Recreational Therapy Department. These activities may include but is not limited to the purchase of food and refreshments(with donor permission), the funding of trips within the community, as well as the purchase of equipment and products that enhance patient well being.

### **GPF 1807 HOMELESS VETERANS PROGRAM**

Funding is used to purchase items that are needed by veterans in the HCHV Program. Items may include the purchase of bus tokens or other transportation cost, food, beverages and clothing. Other items may include the purchase of housing supplies such as appliances, beds, linens, etc. These funds will also be used to fund various social activities that prove beneficial for Veterans reintegration. This may include tickets to sporting events, the theater, movies, etc. Must may also be used to cover the cost of replacing lost identity papers such as birth certificates, drivers license, etc.

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### **GPF 1809 ONCOLOGY FUND**

This fund is used to support the Oncology Department in providing items that assist in the care and well being of oncology patients. This may include the purchase of food and refreshments, as well as the purchase of equipment and products that assist with annual stand downs.

### **GPF 1812 PROSTHETIC TREATMENT CENTER**

This fund is used to support the Prosthetics Department in providing items that assist in the care and well being of patients. This may include the purchase of products and equipment such as blind and low vision aids, wheelchair gloves, ice grippers for canes, etc.

### **GPF 1813 ADULT DAY HEALTHCARE**

Used to purchase a variety of items to support the Adult Day Health Care Clinic. Items may include the purchase of food and refreshments for parties, baking products in support of the daily baking initiative and also may be used to fund various entertainment activities for the patients. Other uses may include the purchase of training products and other minor equipment such as TV's & DVD players.

### **GPF 1816 REHABILITATION MEDICINE SERVICE**

This fund is used to purchase equipment or products that enhances Rehabilitation Services to our Veteran patients.

### **GPF 1817 COFFEE CART FUND**

Purchases coffee/creamer/sugar/cups for coffee that is served to outpatients waiting for their appointments.

### **GPF 1820 DISCRETION CHIEF, VOLUNTARY SERVICE**

This is our "all-purpose" fund that we use throughout the year for general purchases that will enhance our medical center programs and/or provide items to benefit veteran's welfare.

### **GPF 1821 PATIENT COMFORT ITEMS**

This account is used to purchase various patient comfort and hygiene items that may include deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush, shaving cream, combs, underwear and socks for indigent patients.

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### **GPF 1826 HEMODIALYSIS FUND**

These funds are used to purchase various items that are needed to enhance the care that Veterans receive in the Hemodialysis Program. Items purchased may include portable CD Players, radios, televisions, batteries, handheld games, DVD's etc.

### **GPF 1827 VAVS SUPPORT FUND**

This fund was established to purchase various holiday items that are needed for decorating. It is also for purchasing items that will be distributed to the veterans in their Holiday Gift Bags. Examples of items may include socks, knit caps, comfort items, wallets, nail clippers, candy, pens, gloves, canteen books and puzzle books. The funds may also be used to purchase food and refreshments for holiday activities and parties.

### **GPF 1830 VAVS SUPPORT FUND**

Used to help fund our Volunteer Recognition Ceremony, Service Organizational Award Program, Volunteer Recognition Week, and numerous active ties and programs that our office conducts as pertains to the Volunteer Program specifically.

### **GPF 1831 BATAVIA GENERAL PURPOSE FUND**

This account is used to fund various Veteran activities that enhance and support the facility mission. This may include but is not limited to the purchase of items such as food and refreshments, equipment, training and educational material and other items that support the Voluntary Service Program.

### **GPF 1834 PROTESTANT CHAPLAIN FUND**

Purchases prayer booklets and religious items, as well refreshments for Chaplain observances/events. These may include Memorial Day, Four Chaplains, Holocaust, etc.

### **GPF 1835 BATAVIA VAVS ACCOUNT**

This account was established to support the Voluntary Service Office by providing recognition for both the Volunteer and Youth Programs. The fund will also be used to provide refreshments that enhance special events such as the VAVS Committee and Volunteer Dinners.

### **GPF 1837 CATHOLIC CHAPLAIN FUND**

Used to purchase religious items for patient use such as prayer booklets.

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### **GPF 1838 PATIENT WELFARE ACCOUNT**

This account was established to provide support the Family Dining Program at Batavia. Funds may be used to purchase food and beverages to support this activity.

### **GPF 1840 HOLIDAY ACCOUNT—BATAVIA**

This account is used to purchase various holiday items that are needed for decorating. It is also used for purchasing items that will be distributed to the Veterans Patients in their holiday gift bag. Examples of items may include socks, knit caps, comfort items, wallets, nail clippers, candy, pens gloves, can teen books and puzzle books.

### **GPF 1841 TELEVISION FUND**

Used to purchase televisions for inpatient rooms and Out-patient waiting areas.

### **GPF 1848 NATIONAL GAMES**

This account is used to provide support and assistance for patients attending the National Games Events. These events may include the Golden Age Games, National Veterans Wheelchair Games, Winter Sports Clinic, Summer Sports Clinics and Creative Arts Festival.

### **GPF 1860 NURSING HOME CARE UNIT (Ward 9A)**

This account was established to purchase various items that will benefit the patient sin our nursing home care unit. The funds may be used to purchase food and refreshments for ward parties, baking products that support the daily baking initiative. It may also be used to fund various entertainment activities for the patients.

### **GPF 1930 BATAVIA RECREATION ACCOUNT**

This account is used to provide funding for resident social and recreational activities. This may include the purchase of food and refreshments, as well as equipment and supplies that are used for patient recreational activities.

### **GPF 1931 WOMENS WELLNESS CENTER**

This account is used to purchase items that are needed to enhance the care for our female Veterans in the Women's Wellness Program. This may include the purchase of educational brochures, training seminars, and various outreach activities. This account may also be used for expenditures from the Susan B. Komen Grant Program.

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### **GPF 1932 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROGRAM**

Assists female veterans in our Domestic Violence Program. Purchases food certificates from various vendors such as Top's, Wegmans, etc. for indigent female veterans. Also used to purchase food baskets during the holidays for indigent female veterans and their family members.

### **GPF 1933 WOMEN VETERANS RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM**

This account has been established to provide support of the women's residential program. This may include recreational events and activities, food and refreshments and off-station excursions.

### **GPF 1935 PTSD RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAM**

This fund was established to support activities that aids in the treatment and rehabilitation of the Veteran Patients. This may include off station trips to local recreational events and activities.

### **GPF 1937 NO ONE DIES ALONE PROGRAM**

To purchase comfort care items, journals, CD players, CD's, snacks, etc. for the veteran in hospice. Also to purchase meals and snacks for family members while they sit with their loved one during their final hours.

### **GPF 1939 R.E.S.T.**

Used to support activities and services related to Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom. Examples include the purchase of food, refreshments, entertainment to support the REST picnic as well as, other community outreach initiatives.

### **GPF 1940 VOCATIONAL PROGRAMS**

This account was established to purchase buss passes, tokens, etc for veterans within the Vocational Program.

### **GPF 1941 SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT PROGRAM**

Used to purchase items that are needed for veteran patients, especially those that will help with incentive therapy as part of their treatment process. Items may include shirts, hats, canteen books, in addition to small appliances such as microwaves, coffee pots.

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**GPF 1942 VISUALLY IMPAIRED FUND**

This fund is used to purchase items needed for veteran patients, especially items that will help with visual impairments.

**GPF 1944 COMPING / SERVICE RECOVERY PROGRAM**

These funds are used to purchase comping coupons for veteran patients who are in need of service recovery.
