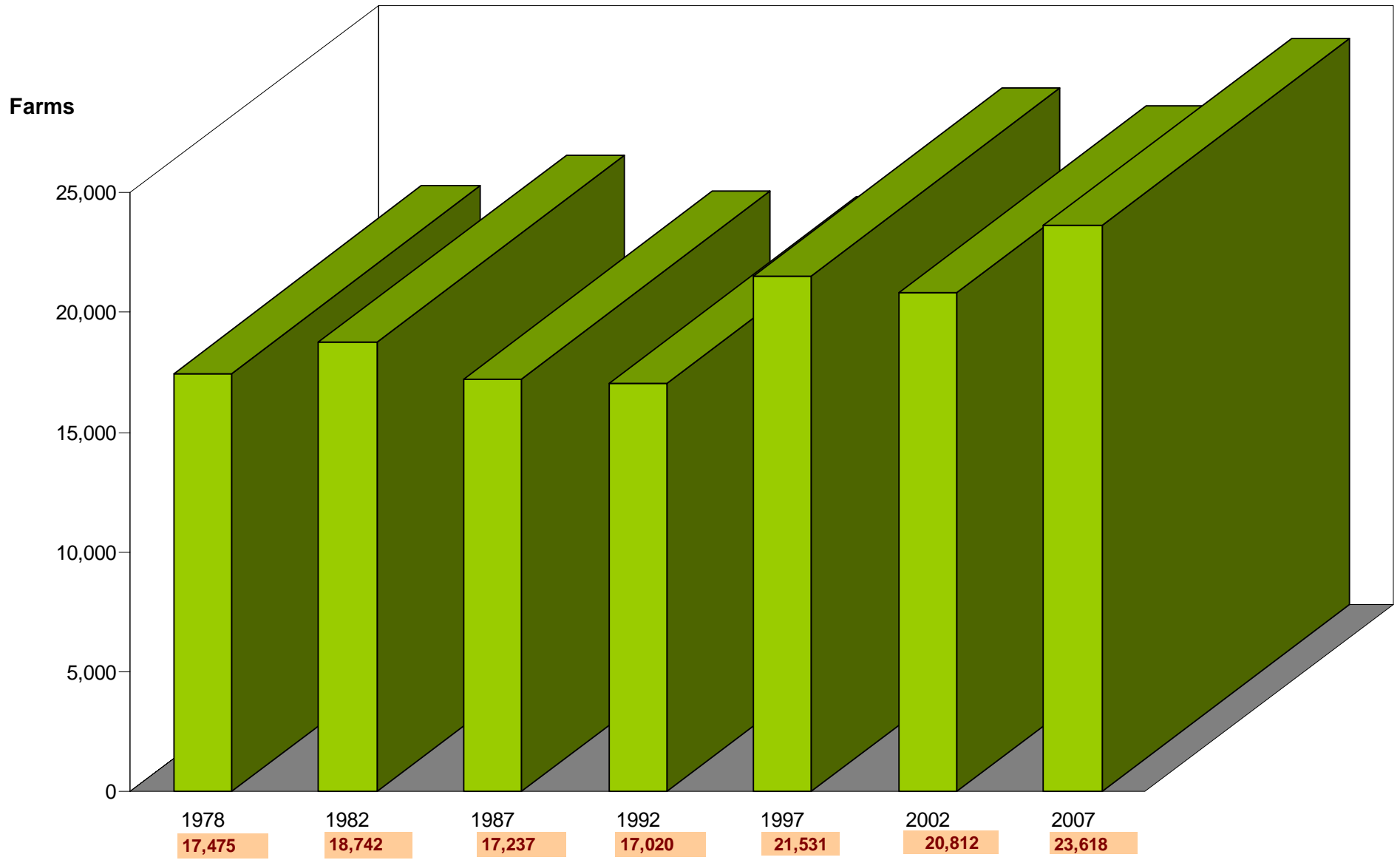

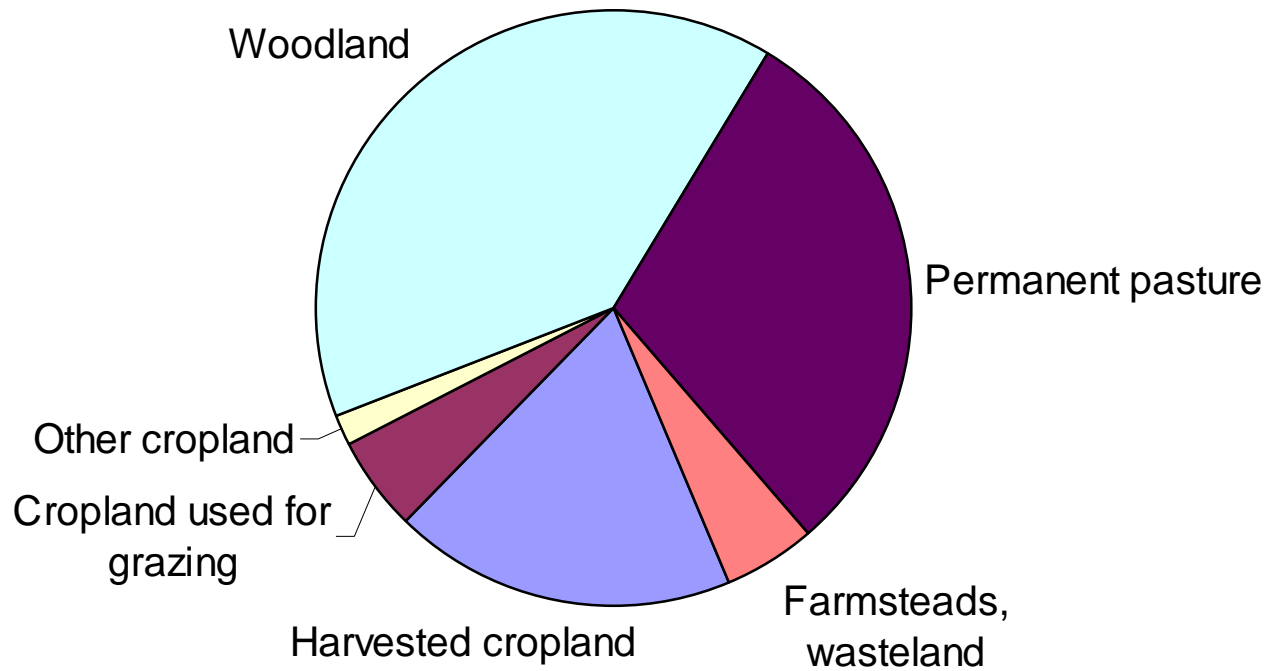

West Virginia Census of Agriculture Number of Farms: 1978 - 2007*

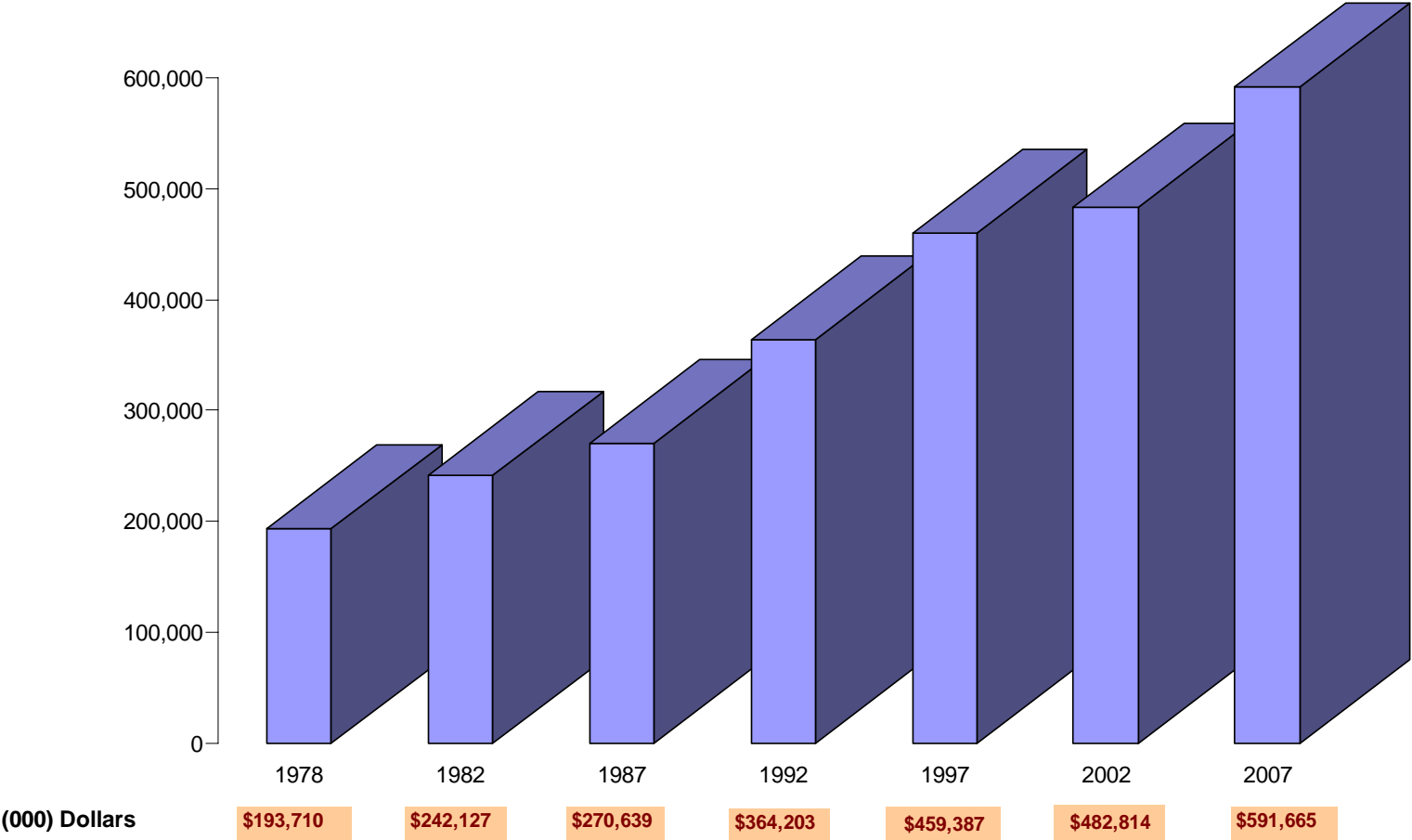

2007 West Virginia Farm Land

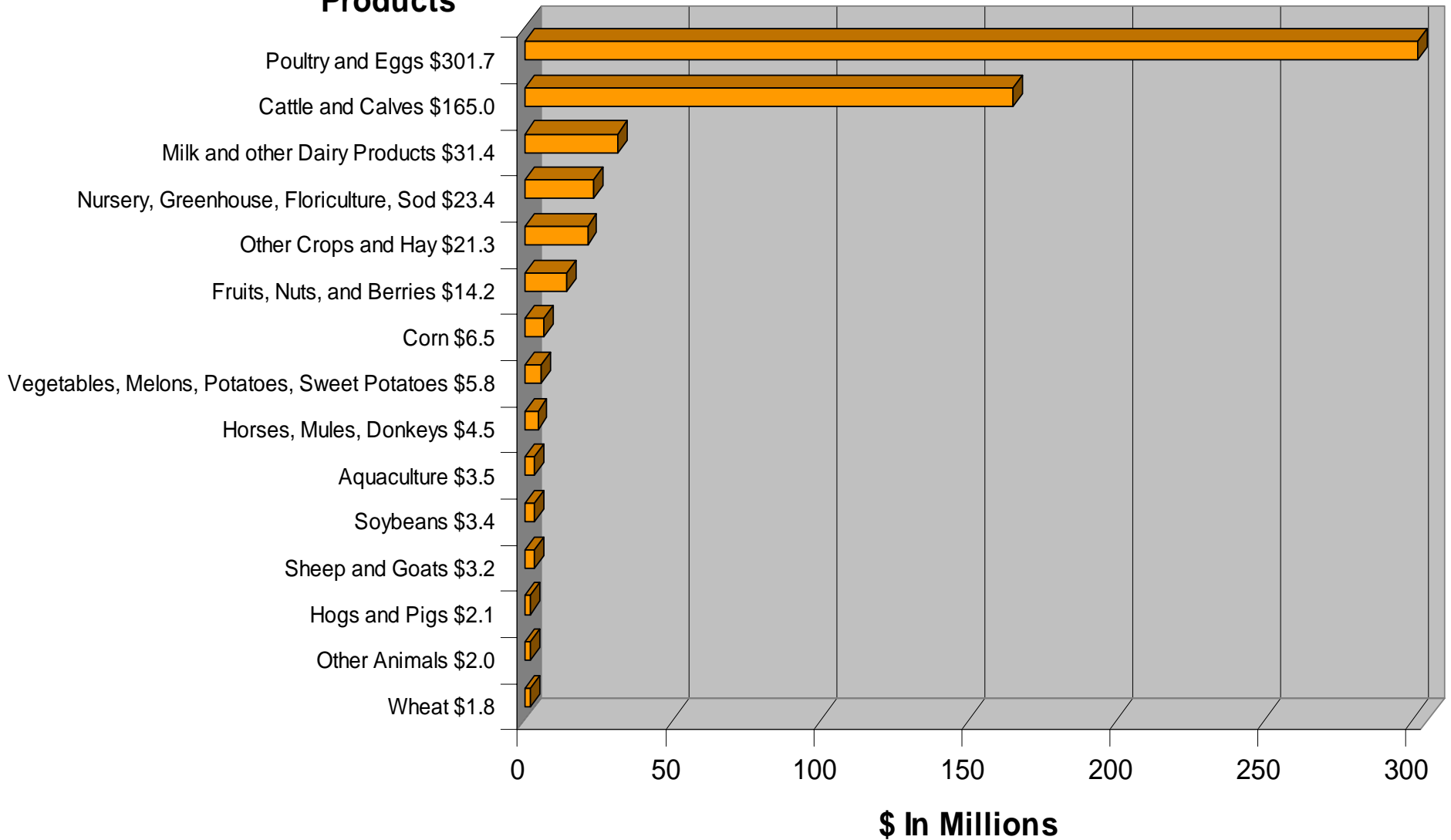


Market Value of Agricultural Products Sold 1978 - 2007

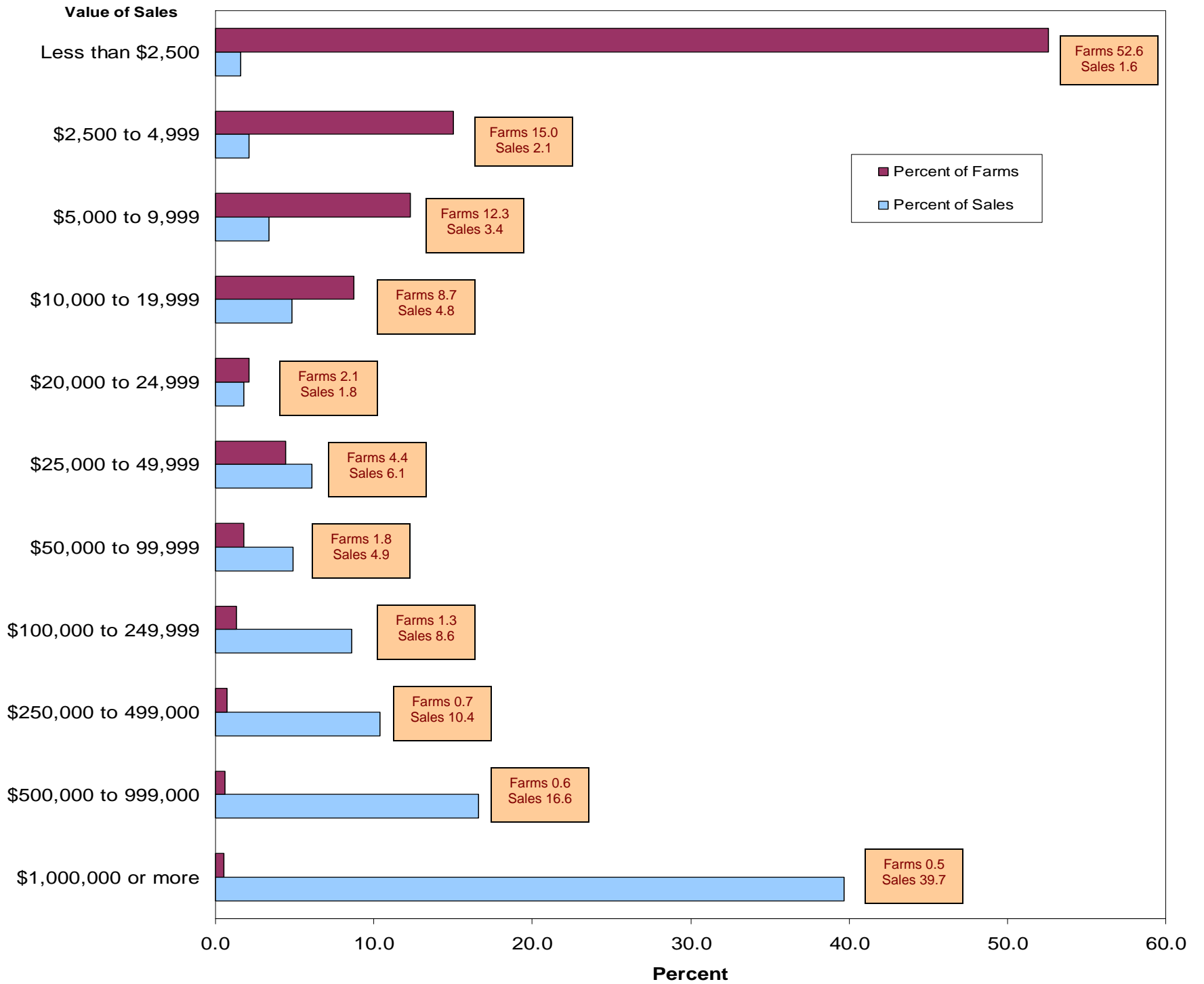


West Virginia Market Value of Agricultural Products Sold by Category: Top 15 Commodities

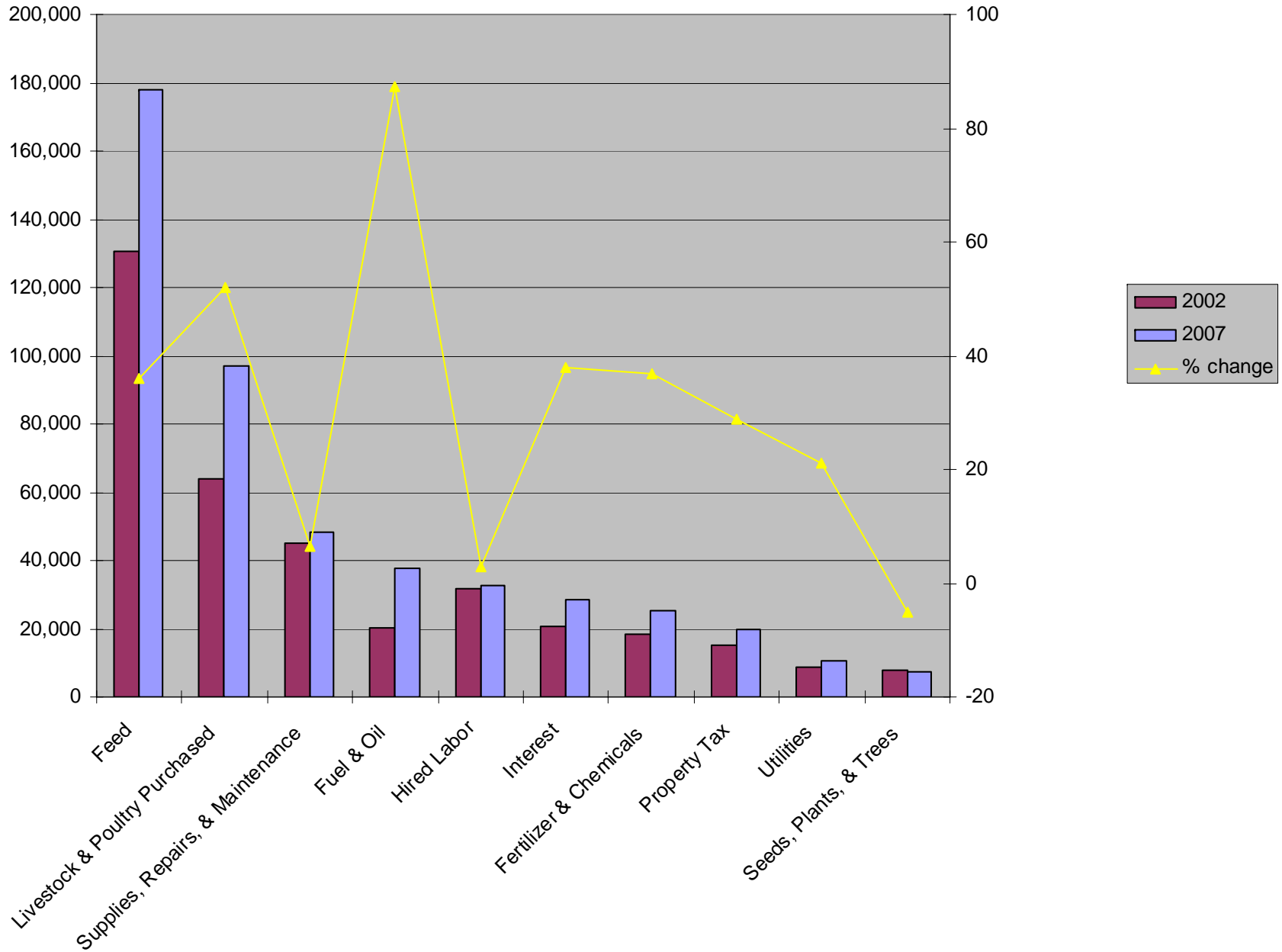
West Virginia Percent of Farms and Market Value of Agricultural Products Sold - 2007



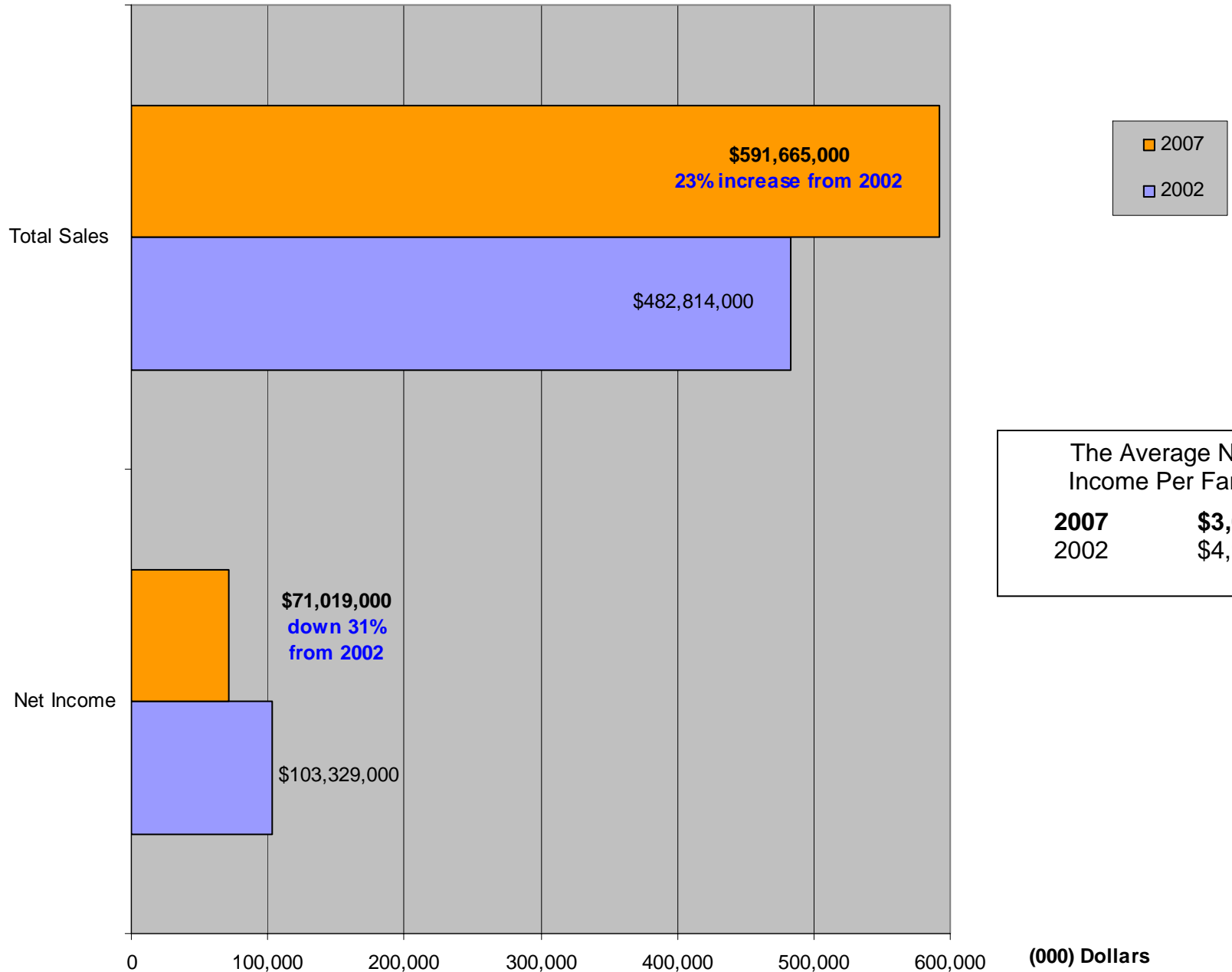
West Virginia Farm Production Expenditures, Selected Items and Percent Change

Other West Virginia Census Data Facts (2007)

Farms employed 9,738 workers with a \$32,794,000 payroll

85 farms hired migrant workers in 2007

39% of farms had more than one operator

84 farms used 2,158 acres for organic production

132 farms were converting 3,805 acres to organic production

29% of the farm operators in West Virginia are women

Estimated total market value of land and buildings: \$8,819,799,000

Average per farm (market value of land and buildings) \$373,435

1,011 farms produced and sold value-added products

5,455 farms practiced rotational or management intensive grazing

8,470 farms had a historic barn built prior to 1960

Farms with horses, at 6,927 increased 11 percent from 2002

Number of farms with goats increased 50 percent from 2002 to 2,136

Goat inventory at 27,946 increased 60 percent from 2002
