GENERAL POA

- ★ When you grant someone a General Power of Attorney (POA), you are granting him/her virtually unlimited power to act on your behalf.
- ★ Keep in mind that the POA is only as good as the institution that will accept it and some institutions on base require a Special POA.
- ★ Be aware that there are many horror stories of military members granting General Powers of Attorney to individuals who act contrary to their wishes. For example, individuals are legally bound to pay all debt incurred by their Attorney-in-Fact, pursuant to use of the General Power of Attorney.
- ★ It is of the utmost importance that you carefully analyze your need for a General POA before granting this extensive power. In most cases, a Special will suffice.

SPECIAL POA

- ★ When you grant someone a Special POA, you are granting your Attorney-in-Fact the power to act on your behalf in only LIMITED situations.
- ★ When drafting a special POA, we ask for as much detail as possible to ensure the power is specifically limited to the authority granted.
- ★ Many institutions (including those on base) REQUIRE Special POAs to protect both you and the agency. It is always a good idea to contact the agency and ask if there is any specific wording they require in order to accept the POA.
- * The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires you to use IRS Form 2848 to grant another person the authority to file taxes on your behalf. The legal office and the base tax office have IRS Form 2848. This document can also be found at www.irs.gov. Notarization of this document is not required.

ALWAYS REMEMBER

- "No agency is required to accept any power of attorney. It is at their discretion.
- It is difficult to revoke a power of attorney once authorized. Make the termination dates that are reasonable and allow for the necessary time only.
- Take great care in choosing your Attorney-in-Fact, you are granting the legal authority to act on your behalf.
