Welcome to the San Antonio Uniformed Services Health Education Consortium (SAUSHEC). These auxiliaries are the spouse organizations at our MTFs, and they provide many great services, including some financial support for SAUSHEC activities. I encourage your spouse to participate in one of these organizations during your stay in San Antonio.

During the month of June, we will conduct orientation and in-processing at both MTFs for training programs that begin in July. It is critical that you coordinate your activities with your program as individual requirements vary among programs and clinical departments. The schedule will allow time to interface with your program director and will provide some unscheduled time for you to set up your new home. Several events planned during orientation will help prepare your family for your training experience in San Antonio. While your participation is mandatory, family participation is voluntary. However, I encourage you to include them in these activities, as they will help with the transition into your very demanding assignment.

One such event is the Welcome Social, which SAUSHEC will sponsor on the evening of the 27<sup>th</sup> of June. This event is planned for both individuals and families and provides a great opportunity to meet fellow residents/interns, family members, program faculty and senior leaders from both facilities in a relaxed, social setting.

In the past year, some programs have come under the leadership of new program directors or associate program directors. We are accustomed to change in the military and have selected capable and accomplished individuals to continue the tradition of excellence which SAUSHEC programs have always enjoyed. In response to the congressionally mandated Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) law, BAMC and the 59MDW are continuing to integrate and increase collaboration for all services (including educational programs).
