Did you know that ...

USAID has collaborated with Paraguay in the following areas since 1961:

- ♦ The creation of the first Regional Education Centers (1962 1976) in San Lorenzo, Encarnación, Villa Rica, Concepción, Ciudad del Este and Pedro Juan Caballero
- ♦ The construction of many of the key highways such as the Trans Chaco to Pozo Colorado and the one from Asunción to Ciudad del Este.
- ♦ The introduction and improvement of crops such as wheat and sorghum.
- ◆ The development of the first family planning program and the campaign to eradicate malaria.
