IMPORTANT NOTE: Fort Riley begins vaccinating against H1N1

With limited supply, small groups within the top priority groups have been targeted for vaccination to include daycare providers, certain health care workers and pregnant women. "Our hope is to have an increased supply in November to allow for vaccinating larger numbers," said the chief of preventive medicine at Irwin Army Community Hospital.

Top priority groups identified by the Fort Riley post are consistent with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and include:

- Pregnant women
- Health care workers with direct patient contact
- People who care for or live with children 6 months of age or less
- Children 6 months to 4 years of age
- Children 5- to 18-years-old with serious health conditions to include cancer, blood disorders (including sickle cell), chronic lung disease (such as asthma and Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), diabetes, heart disease, kidney disorders, liver disorders, neurological disorders (such as epilepsy, cerebral palsy, brain or spinal cord injuries, moderate to profound intellectual disability or mental retardation or developmental delay) and neuromuscular disorders (muscular dystrophy and multiple sclerosis).

Important information about the H1N1 vaccine to know is that it is very safe. "The flu vaccine changes each year and so to change to a different virus strain is normal business for makers of the H1N1 vaccine, which are the same makers of the regular flu vaccine," Benne said. The nasal mist formula is only for healthy 2- to 49-year-olds. One vaccination is required for those 10 years and older. Those who are 6 months to less than 10 years of age will need two vaccinations at least four weeks apart. The nasal vaccine must be separated by at least four weeks from any other live type vaccine such as the regular or seasonal nasal vaccine.

Serious health conditions include conditions such as:

- Cancer
- Blood disorders (including sickle cell disease)
- Lung disease (including asthma or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD)
- Diabetes
- Heart, Kidney or Liver disease
- Neurological disorders (including nervous system, brain or spinal cord, muscular dystrophy and multiple sclerosis)
- People with weakened immune systems (including people with AIDS or those who are receiving chemotherapy)

Due to a limited supply and unknown specific delivery dates, the clinic times and locations updates can be obtained by calling the flu hotline at 240-4FLU.

IACH I-Tours

IACH *Information* Tours intent is to make a "lasting first impression" on identified target audiences in the community by showcasing available services. IACH I-Tours are scheduled for the first Wednesday of each month from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. There will be 10 available slots for the tour. Specialized group briefings can be arranged on an individual basis for particular affiliations and organizations. • IACH No-shows Update

- IACH's goal is to reduce the frequency of no-shows. Missed appointments negatively affect access to care, impact overall patient flow and contribute to lost revenues. Therefore, cancellations should be done 48 to 72 hours prior to the appointment.
- For fiscal year 2008 there were a total of 18,923 no-shows. A total of 20,923 appointments were recorded as "no-shows" for fiscal year 2009, which was an 11 percent increase from the previous year.
- However, there was an increase of over 31,000 appointments from fiscal year 2008 to fiscal year 2009, a 12 percent increase. Both fiscal year 2008 and 2009 had a no show rate of 7% for the year. The overhead related to these missed appointments totaled more than \$4 million (\$197 per visit).

Staff Judge Advocate:

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Money Back for New Vehicle Purchases

Overview:

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act permits taxpayers to take a deduction for state and local sales and excise taxes paid on the purchase of new cars, light trucks, motor homes and motorcycles. Consumers who are considering buying a new car may find that this tax incentive means there may have never been a better time to buy.

Here are seven things you should know about this new deduction:

State and local sales taxes paid on up to \$49,500 of the purchase price of qualifying vehicles are deductible. Qualified motor vehicles generally include new (not used) cars, light trucks, motor homes and motorcycles.

Purchases must occur after Feb. 16, 2009, and before Jan. 1, 2010.

- 1. This deduction can be taken regardless of whether or not you itemize other deductions on your tax return.
- 2. Taxpayers will claim this deduction when filing their 2009 federal income tax return next year
- 3. The amount of the deduction is phased out for taxpayers whose modified adjusted gross income is between \$125,000 and \$135,000 for individual filers and between \$250,000 and \$260,000 for joint filers.
- 4. The deduction may not be taken on 2008 tax returns.

Questions and Answers:

Q. What are considered to be "qualified motor vehicles" for the purpose of this deduction? **A.** A qualified motor vehicle is a passenger automobile, light truck or motorcycle which has a gross vehicle weight rating of 8,500 pounds or less. A motor home is also considered a qualified motor vehicle.

Q. If I purchase a really expensive car, can I deduct the entire amount of state and local sales taxes paid on the vehicle?

A. No, only state and local sales taxes paid on up to \$49,500 of the purchase price of a qualifying vehicle are deductible.

Q. Does the purchase of a used car qualify for this deduction?

A. No. In order to take the deduction, you must be the first owner of the vehicle.

Q. Do I have to itemize in order to take this deduction?

A. No. Anyone who qualifies can take this deduction. You will claim this deduction when filing your 2009 federal income tax return in 2010. There will be a line on the 2009 tax forms, just follow the instructions.

Q. What about those 2008 models still sitting on the lot — can I claim the deduction if I purchase one of last year's models?

A. Yes, you can take the deduction as long as you are the vehicle's first owner.

Q. At what income does the deduction fully phase out?

A. The amount of the deduction is phased out for taxpayers whose modified adjusted gross income is between \$125,000 and \$135,000 for individual filers and between \$250,000 and \$260,000 for joint filers.

Q. What if my state doesn't have a sales tax?

A. Purchases made in states without a sales tax — such as Alaska, Delaware, Hawaii, Montana, New Hampshire and Oregon — can also qualify for the deduction. Taxpayers in states

without a sales tax are entitled to deduct other qualifying fees or taxes imposed by the state or

local government. The fees or taxes that qualify must be assessed on the purchase of the vehicle and must be based on the vehicle's sales price or as a per unit fee.

Q. Can I take the deduction for a second or third vehicle I purchase?

A. Yes. There is no limit on the number of cars for which you can claim the deduction, provided each car is a qualified vehicle under the law.

Q. Can I take this deduction for any qualified vehicle — even those made by foreign car companies?

A. Yes. As long as it is a new car and otherwise qualifies, you may take the deduction.

Important News:

Post 9/11 GI Bill Transferability Policy Quick Reference

To be eligible to transfer Post 9/11 GI Bill benefits a Soldier must meet three requirements:

1. Be eligible for the Post 9/11 GI Bill.

2. Have at least 6 years of military service when the request to transfer benefits is submitted; all military service counts towards the six year requirement except time in the Individual Ready Reserves.

3. Not have an adverse action flag.

If all three requirements are met, a Soldier is eligible to submit a request to transfer benefits. Soldiers who transfer benefits incur an additional service obligation in accordance with the following rules:

<u>Rule</u>

Years of Service When Request is submitted

Additional Service Obligation

1. At least six years but less than 10 years. Four years from the date the request was submitted.

2. 10 or more years. Four years or up to Retention Control Point or Mandatory Retirement date from the date the request was submitted, whichever is less.

From 1 August 2009 until 1 August 2013, the below temporary rules for additional service obligation apply. Years of service for the temporary rules is always based on length of service as of 1 August 2009 regardless of when the request to transfer is submitted.

<u>Rule</u>

Years of Service as of 1 Aug 2009

Additional Service Obligation

1. 20 or more years. No additional service obligation.

2. Approved retirement with a date from 1 September 2009 through 1 June 2010. No additional service obligation.

3. 19 but less than 20 years. One year of service from the date the request was submitted.

4. 18 but less than 19 years. Two years of service from the date the request was submitted.

5. 17 but less than 18 years. Three years of service from the date the request was submitted. Eligible dependents are spouse and dependent children who are enrolled in DEERS and eligible for benefits under DEERS on the date the request to transfer is submitted. Dependents of dual military couple have to be sponsored by one Soldier but registered under both Soldiers.

Submitting a Request to Transfer Benefits

Using CAC card or DFAS pin, log on to the DoD Transferability of Education Benefits (TEB) web page located at <u>https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/TEB/</u>
 The Soldier's name and Family Members who are eligible for benefits under DEERS will be shown.

3. Soldiers must click all boxes to indicate that they have read and understand each statement on the transfer request page. Soldiers who are eligible for MGIB, REAP, or MGIB-SR benefits are required to make an irrevocable decision to convert from one of those education benefit programs to the Post 9/11 GI Bill. Submission of a request to transfer benefits is considered an irrevocable conversion from one of these three programs to the Post 9/11 GI Bill. For those Soldiers who are not eligible for one of these three programs, all statements on the transfer page regarding conversion from these three programs do not apply. However, those Soldiers must still mark those statements.

4. To transfer benefits to an eligible dependent, click the edit button on their name line. (If the dependent name is grayed out or the edit button does not work, it means that dependent is not eligible for DEERS benefits and thus is not eligible to receive transferred benefits.)

a. List the number of months of benefits to transfer to that dependent.

b. Select the start date you want the dependent to be able to use transferred benefits. You can use either the calendar on the page or type in the start date. Format for date is YYYY-MM-DD. If you type in the date, be sure to use the dashes. When selecting the start date, remember that the VA will not pay benefits to a dependent prior to that date.

c. Select the end date after which your dependent can no longer use transferred benefits. Select this date carefully. After this date the VA will not pay benefits to a dependent even if the dependent has months of benefits remaining. When selecting this date consider that a spouse can use benefits up to 15 years after you leave active duty and that children can use the benefits up to their twenty-sixth birthday.

d. After you have filled in the number of months to transfer to the dependent and selected the start and end dates, hit the save button. Make sure revoke is not checked unless it is your intent to revoke benefits transfer.

e. After the request is submitted, the TEB site will return to the original page with all your eligible dependents. To transfer benefits to another dependent, repeat the above steps. Remember the total months you can transfer to your dependents can be no more than 36 months or the number of months of Post 9/11 GI Bill benefits to which you are entitled, whichever is less.

5. After you have completed your request to transfer benefits, in the upper left corner of the TEB site, you will see your name, status submitted, and the date of status will be blank. The TEB site does track the date submitted and the certifying official will see it. You will not receive any confirmation number or any electronic message. Confirmation that your request has been submitted is the status submitted as shown on the TEB site.

6. To track the status of your request, you will have to return to the TEB page and monitor the status.

7. After the request is submitted, it will enter a queue of submitted requests. Currently, the certification site does not allow certification officials to retrieve a specific request. System upgrades are being made and it is expected that certification officials will be able to process specific requests by the last week of July. In the meantime, requests are being processed as quickly as possible within current system limitations. After a request is approved, the status of your request will change to approved and the date of status will be the date you submitted your request.

8. Once your request is approved, your dependent has to submit a request for a certificate of eligibility to the VA. They must submit a VA Form 22-1990e. The VA Form 22-1990e is not on the VA's VONAPP sight. They expect to have the VA Form 22-1990e on the VONAPP page by 17 July 2009. Once it is on the VONAPP site, it can be completed and submitted to the VA electronically. The link to the VA VONAPP website is at

The recommended additional information is not required. The TEB site will automatically transfer the

recommended additional information is not required. The TEB site will automatically transfer the data to the VA which is needed to process a dependent's request for a certificate of eligibility.

9. After the dependent receives the VA certificate of eligibility, it must be presented to the school. The school will have to complete a VA Form 22-1999 which will be sent to the VA. If the school is participating in the Yellow Ribbon Program and your dependent has received Yellow Ribbon Program funds from the school, the school needs to indicate that on the VA Form 22-1999 prior to sending to the VA.

10. Tuition funds will be sent direct from the VA to the school. Children using transferred benefits will receive the monthly living stipend and the books and supplies stipend. Spouses using transferred benefits will only receive the monthly living stipend and the books and supplies stipend if they use the benefits after you separate from active duty.

Post 9/11 GI Bill Estimator

This estimator tool is very important. Soldiers and veterans alike need to be reminded that once they elect to convert to the Post 9/11 GI Bill (e.g., by filling out a VA-Form 22-1990 OR submitting the TEB (Transferability of Education Benefits) application, they are making an irrevocable decision to convert from their current GI Bill to the Post 9/11 GI Bill. There are numerous instances in which an individual is better off by NOT converting to the Post 9/11 GI Bill. Bill.

Change to Upfront Tuition Assistance (TA) for all GoArmyEd Schools

Effective 1 Oct 09, Army will pay TA directly to all accredited colleges and universities in GoArmyEd, both Letter of Instruction (LOI) schools and Non-LOI schools. Currently, Active Duty Soldiers attending Non-LOI schools use <u>www.goarmyed.com</u> to submit their TA reimbursement requests, but pay their tuition directly to the school. Beginning 1 Oct 09, these Soldiers will receive TA upfront with the Army paying tuition directly to the school.

Registering in GoArmyEd

Effective 1 April, Department of the Army (ACES) and Army Education Services completely transitioned to the GoArmyEd portal. That means all Soldiers (regardless of rank) must establish an account in GoArmyEd to receive education services. The services include on-duty military programs like GT Improvement, Leadership Development, Army Personnel testing, In- and Out-Processing, and college enrollments.

Soldiers must go to <u>www.goarmyed.com</u> and click on the "New User" tab to establish an account. You will be asked to change your password, then complete the "Required In-Processing Steps" to finish the process.

If you have problems or decide not to pre-register, you will have to complete these steps the next time you visit one of our centers:

Family Members, Department of Army Civilians, Retirees, Veterans who wish to receive (or continue to receive) our services, as in counseling, LSEC courses and testing, must visit one of the Learning Centers to establish their GoArmyEd account.

Leader Skills Enhancement Courses (LSEC)

LSEC is designed to assist in the training of Noncommissioned Officers and Soldiers demonstrating leadership potential in the advanced skills needed to perform at higher-level leadership and staff positions. LSEC benefits the Army by providing the Soldier specific leadership training which will enhance performance of the Soldier and the unit. Commanders can schedule training to meet unit needs or enroll the Soldier in an open scheduled class. Classes are available to Family Members, Military Retirees, and Department of Defense Civilians on space-available basis. Tuition is at no cost to the student and books are provided for all courses. The Troops to Teachers (TTT) program enriches the guality of the American education by helping to place and retain mature, motivated, experienced and dedicated personnel in our nation's classrooms. Military members with at least six years of service and a bachelor's degree may be eligible for financial assistance through the Troops to Teachers program. Eligible military members can receive up to a \$5,000 stipend for educational expenses to obtain a teacher's license. Additionally, eligible military members who work in a low-income school for at least three years may receive a \$10,000 bonus. If a military member accepts the \$5,000 stipend they are only eligible to receive a \$5,000 bonus so the maximum financial assistance available through Troops to Teachers is \$10,000. Buyer Beware "Diploma Mills"

GoArmyEd wants students to be cautious of "Diploma Mills." These are schools that offer certificates, degrees and diplomas for a fee. These schools are not accredited by an accrediting body recognized by the Department of Education. Tuition Assistance is not approved, promotion points are not authorized, and the credentials will not be posted to Official Military Personnel Records (OMPF) from these agencies. Soldiers can confirm the status of a school by checking the list of approved schools in GoArmyEd, contacting the local Army Education Center or the Personnel Administration Center. Furthermore, if it is found that a fraudulent diploma has been entered onto the OMPF the action is punishable administratively under UCMJ.

- Household Hazardous Waste Service Available to Residents: Fort Riley operates a Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) facility for residents to dispose of or pick up, free of charge, common household products. This service is particularly helpful when residents are moving because these items should not be thrown away and they cannot be shipped with household goods. While only active duty military personnel living on the installation may drop-off items, any government ID cardholder may pick-up items.
- Examples of products the facility accepts (and offers for pick up)-cleaning products, paints, disinfectants, drain openers, insecticides, automotive fluids, and mothballs. The HHW facility is located at the Environmental Waste Management Center, Bldg. 1945 in Camp Funston. For more information call 239-6797.

• Fuel wood:

- o Fort Riley's fuel wood regulation (FR200-4) was updated last spring.
- A permit can be purchased for \$25.00 which now allows the permit holder 90 days to cut up to two cords of wood.
- A cord is a stack of wood 4 feet high x 4 feet wide x 8 feet long.

If so, schedule your mandatory <u>Pre-separation Briefing</u> by logging on ACAP Express at <u>https://www.acapexpress.army.mil</u> or by calling 785-239-2278. Briefings are held Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday at 9:00am and 1:00pm. Soldiers reporting for their initial Pre-separation Briefing without a valid AKO account/password and/or arriving late will be re-scheduled.
- You may start the ACAP process up to 12 months prior to separation for ETSing Soldiers and up to 24 months prior to anticipated retirement date for Retiring Soldiers. In no event should the process begin later than 90 days prior to separation. All Soldiers regardless of reason being separated are required to complete this briefing. You do not need orders to begin the ACAP process. ACAP is here to assist Soldiers in determining whether to "get out" or "stay in".

- In addition to the Pre-separation Briefing, all Soldiers are required to attend a 4-hour <u>VA</u> <u>Benefits Briefing</u> prior to separating. This briefing is held Thursdays 9:00am-2:00pm. For those Soldiers injured while in service or want more information on the Vocational Rehabilitation program are welcome to attend the <u>DTAP VA Briefing</u>, Thursdays 2:00-4:00pm.
