

INTEGRATED COASTAL AND OCEAN OBSERVING SYSTEM (ICOOS) ACT OF 2009 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

ACTIVITY: "The Council shall establish or designate an Interagency Ocean Observation Committee which shall--develop contract certification standards and compliance procedures for all non-federal assets, including regional information coordination entities, to establish eligibility for integration into the System and to ensure compliance with all applicable standards and protocols established by the Council, and ensure that regional observations are integrated into the System on a sustained basis".

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration shall function as the lead Federal agency for the implementation and administration of the System, in consultation with the Council, the Interagency Ocean Observation Committee, other Federal agencies that maintain portions of the System, and the regional information coordination entities, and shall – promulgate program guidelines to certify and integrate non-Federal assets, including regional information coordination entities, into the System to provide regional coastal and ocean observation data that meet the needs of user groups from the respective regions".
