USDA Rural Development - Overview

Utilities - Addresses needs for basic services like clean water, sewers and waste disposal, electricity, and telecommunications

Housing - Works to eliminate substandard housing by helping people buy, rent or build decent housing and community facilities

Business - Creates jobs by funding and growing businesses and Cooperatives

Community Development - Operates special initiatives across these programs to improve outreach



Strategic Partners

- Strategy: Persuade people to partner with us
- Action: Integration of all USDA investments with Rural Development, other federal investments and public, private and non-profit sectors
 - Example: National Rural Electric System, 45 million customers and over 1000 cooperative members - capacity to affect rural economy
- Goal: New partnerships and opening the door to extending our efforts



Regional Collaboration

- **Strategy**: Encourage rural areas to invest in opportunities to improve rural economies
- Action: Work together to grow access to new capital and credit funding
 - Provide leadership, education and training, technical support and incentives
- **Goal**: Create regional collaborative efforts between communities and interested and supportive parties



Community Building

- **Strategy**: Improve community outreach institutions
- Action: Channel resources to build self-sustaining communities
- Goal: Create great places to live, raise families, provide recreational opportunities, and infrastructure for high paying jobs



Broadband and Continuous Business Creation

- **Strategy:** Capitalize new businesses, strengthen competition and market access
- Action: Bring high-speed internet service to communities, create thousands of jobs, and improve economic, health care, and educational opportunities.
 - American Recovery and Reinvestment Act provides over \$9 billion for broadband
- Goal: Level the playing field of access to infrastructure



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Capital Markets

- **Strategy**: Focus on how we can bring new investment opportunities to stimulate economic growth
- Action: Integrate Rural Development with other USDA and federal investments and public and private organizations
- Goal: Bolster existing private credit structure through guaranteeing quality loans with lasting community benefits



Regional Food Systems

- Strategy: Use local and regional food systems for wealth creation
- Action: Value-Added Producer Grants to plan activities and create working capital for marketing value-added agricultural products and farm-based renewable energy
- Goal: Opportunities are created locally and revenues are maintained locally



Retooled Loan Assistance

- Using administrative flexibility to provide relief to individuals and businesses in struggling agriculture industries
- Critical to restoring economic prosperity in rural communities, and essential to ensure Americans have access to a safe, secure, and healthy food supply

• Assistance includes:

- Farm Service Agency's increased effort to provide loan assistance to livestock producers
- Rural Development Business and Industry Loan program which has been structured to provide relief to processors and other small businesses in agriculture industries



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Business & Industry Guaranteed Loan Program

Business Eligible For:

- Working capital refinancing
- Machinery and equipment
- Real estate and construction
- Business development and
- expansion

Supports:

- Cooperatives
- Corporations
- Partnerships
- Nonprofit groups
- Federally recognized Indian tribes
- Public bodies
- Individuals

Funds Focused on:

- Creating and retaining quality jobs
- Serving difficult-to-reach populations
- Areas hardest hit by the economic downturn



Implementing Immediate Steps:

- Business & Industry Guaranteed Loans

- Directing at least 10% of the \$1.7 billion in Business & Industry loans to persistent poverty counties
- Helping businesses with credit needs by keeping all existing authorities in the Business and Industry program in place
- Considering loan term adjustments as part of a comprehensive business stabilization strategy, including adjustments in interest rates, principal reduction and loan terms
- Increasing loan guarantee to up to 90%



Immediate Steps Continued

- All loans will be subject to standard underwriting criteria and working with borrowers and lenders on a case-by-case basis to provide needed financing.
- Providing incentives to lenders who finance businesses with jobs that pay at least 125% of the national minimum wage and/or provide health care benefits.
- Reducing loan guarantee fees by at least 50%.
- Eliminating annual renewal fee that lenders had been required to pay to maintain the guarantee.
- Working with lenders to discuss challenges they're facing



Alternative Energy

- **Strategy**: Constantly conduct feasibility studies, research, develop and invest in new alternative energy
- Action: Implement the Renewable Energy Provisions of the 2008 Farm Bill
 - Over \$1 billion of mandatory funding over 5 years for expanding advanced biorefineries and energy audits, feasibility studies and renewable energy systems and energy efficiency
- Goal: Create jobs through continuous formation and capitalization of new businesses



2008 Farm Bill - Energy Provisions

Biorefinery Assistance - Loan guarantees for development, construction and retrofitting of commercialscale biorefineries, and grants to pay for development and construction of demonstration-scale biorefineries

Repowering Assistance - Payments to biorefineries to replace fossil fuels used to produce heat or power to operate the biorefineries with renewable biomass

Bioenergy Program For Advanced Biofuels - Payments to to eligible agricultural producers to support and ensure an expanding production of advanced biofuels



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2008 Farm Bill Continued

Rural Energy for America Program - Grants and loan guarantees for energy audits, feasibility studies and project development of renewable energy systems and energy efficiency improvements

Biomass Research and Development - Competitive grants, contracts and financial assistance for research and development and demonstration of biofuels and biobased products, and the methods, practices and technologies for their production

Rural Energy Self-Sufficiency Initiative - Grants to enable eligible rural communities to increase energy self-sufficiency



American Recovery and Reinvestment Act



Highlights:

\$11 billion for a smarter grid to move renewable energy from rural areas where it's produced to cities where it's mostly used

\$6.3 billion for state and local renewable energy and energy efficiency efforts

\$600 million in green job training programs – \$100 million to expand line worker training programs and \$500 million for green workforce training
