Loans, grants and loan guarantees are also available to supply drinking water, sanitary sewer, solid waste and storm water drainage facilities. Rural communities that need technical assistance and training with their water, wastewater, and solid waste management issues may receive grants to help them meet their needs.

Building and maintaining America's vast rural electric, telephone, and broadband infrastructure is an important financing responsibility of USDA Rural Development as well. The grants, loans and loan guarantees not only bring light to rural homes and businesses, it minimizes the digital divide and allows businesses and communities to compete economically in a global marketplace, and brings advanced educational and health care services to more remote rural areas.
