A power of attorney is a legal document by which a person, gives someone else, called the attorney-in-fact or agent, the authority to act as the first person's agent or attorney. The attorney-in-fact can then conduct business on behalf of the grantor in the grantor's absence. The transactions of the attorney-in-fact are binding upon the grantor as though the grantor had personally conducted the transaction in question.

A general power of attorney gives the attorney-in-fact the right to conduct practically any type of transaction the grantor could do personally, including selling property or obtaining and using credit.

A special power of attorney gives the attorney-in-fact the right to act on the grantor's behalf for a specific transaction, such as registering a motor vehicle or caring for minor children.
