HONORARY COMMANDERS PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Honorary Commanders Program was developed to encourage an exchange of ideas, share experiences and foster friendship between key members of the local civilian community and the Charleston military community. The program provides a unique opportunity for Charleston area community leaders to shadow Joint Base Charleston Wing, Group, Squadron and Mission Partner commanders.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Honorary Commanders Program is to educate key community leaders about the varied missions of Joint Base Charleston units and mission partners, to foster a supportive relationship with the community, increase military involvement in civic endeavors and organizations and make the members of the local community part of our Team Charleston family.

HISTORY

Charleston's Honorary Commanders Program is one of the most successful in Air Mobility Command (AMC) and has been used as a model by several AMC bases and other commands throughout the Air Force.

The program was started in 1996 jointly with 437th Airlift Wing and the 315th Airlift Wing (Reserves) as the Charleston Air Force Base Honorary Commanders Program. After undergoing some modifications, the program was established as a separate program for the 437th Airlift Wing active duty commanders in 2001 and has been inducting a new group of community leaders from a cross-section of the community every year since.

With the stand-up of Joint Base Charleston in 2010, the program was renamed the Joint Base Charleston Honorary Commanders Program and expanded to include active duty Navy and Army commanders from our joint mission partners on the Weapons Station. The number of civilians participating in the program increased from 32 to 45, and the number of active duty commanders participating in the program increased from 33 to 40.

HONORARY COMMANDERS ADVISORY COUNCIL OVERVIEW

The Joint Base Charleston Advisory Council consists of community leaders who have transitioned out of the Honorary Commanders Program after having actively served two or more years in that program. The Council was established to assist the base and community leaders in solving problems of mutual interest; help provide continuity in the community relations program, in spite of frequent changes of military personnel; and to develop and accomplish other projects as the Advisory Council deems necessary in the best interest of Joint Base Charleston and the tri-county area. Their objectives are to increase civilian understanding of the military's mission; identify common interests of civilian and military populations; recognize problem areas; and support community efforts of mutual concern.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Advisory Council is to continue to build on the strong partnership that has been formed, continue to educate the community about the mission of Joint Base Charleston, its mission partners and the military in general, and to serve as advocate in the community on issues affecting Joint Base Charleston.

HISTORY

The Joint Base Charleston Honorary Commanders Advisory Council was established in 2003 as the Charleston Air Force Base Advisory Group, consisting of 28 local community leaders who had "retired" out of the Honorary Commanders Program. It stemmed from its members' desires to remain an integral part of the military community. Their motto was, "Charleston AFB has served us, now it is our turn to serve Charleston AFB." In 2006, the name was changed to the Charleston Air Force Base Advisory Council, a charter was written and approved and they held their first election for officers and executive board members. Since that time, they have held annual and quarterly meetings, bi-annual election of officers and inducted additional members. They are now 70 members strong. Following the stand-up of Joint Base Charleston in 2010, their name was officially changed to Joint Base Charleston Honorary Commanders Advisory Council in 2011.

HONORARY COMMANDERS INDUCTION DAY MARCH 14, 2012

The 2012 Honorary Commanders Induction Day started with welcome comments and mission briefings given by Col Richard McComb, Joint Base Charleston commander, and Col Erik Hansen, 437th Airlift Wing commander, followed by a base tour and an up-close look at a C-17 Globemaster III. Then it was on to the Charleston Club where they were administered the oath of office to formally induct them into the program. The day ended with a reception in their honor and social time with their respective active-duty commanders.


Additionally, five retiring Honorary Commanders were recognized for their active support during the past two years and were officially inducted into the Advisory Council during the ceremony.
