

5. Know your local "trade policy" geography



Front burner Trade Policy Initiatives (which impact which region...)

- Latin America → U.S. Free Trade Agreements Peru, CAFTA-DR, Colombia, Panama.
- Africa and Least Developed → WTO-led Integrated Framework, AGOA, African Regional Orgs (EAC, ECOWAS) and TIFA-like things
- Asia Regional Orgs like ASEAN, APEC
- Middle East "MEPI"





4. Get a copy of the key trade-"insider" guides



- The "Integrated Framework" for TA/TCB to LDCs
- A multi-stakeholder "Diagnostic Trade Integration Study" aka DTIS (just the 50 "Least-developed Countries")
- WTO's Trade Policy Review
- Virtually all countries—but, not Ethiopia, Iraq, or Afghanistan—(Why is that?)
- USTR National Trade Estimates Report -- for the bigger traders
 --Egypt yes, Niger no
