ARMY POLICY ON SEXUAL ASSUALT

• Sexual assault is a criminal offense that has no place in the Army.

• It is punishable under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ)





SEXUAL ASSAULT DEFINED

- Sexual assault is intentional sexual contact, characterized by <u>use of</u> <u>force</u>, <u>physical threat</u>, or <u>abuse of authority</u>, <u>when the victim</u> <u>does not or can't consent</u>
- Sexual assault can occur without regard to gender or <u>spousal</u> relationship or <u>the age of the victim</u>
- "Consent" shall not be deemed or construed to mean the failure by the victim to offer physical resistance. Consent is not given when a person uses force, threat of force, coercion or when the victim is <u>asleep</u>, <u>incapacitated</u>, or <u>unconscious</u>





TYPES OF SEXUAL ASSAULT

- Rape
- Nonconsensual sodomy
- Indecent assault
- Attempts to commit these acts

SEXUAL ASSAULT TRENDS

Current sexual assault trend data shows that:

- The majority of military victims are 20-24 year-old females in ranks PVT-SPC
- Most military alleged perpetrators are 20-24 year-old males in ranks PVT-SPC-
- Most military assaults occur in Soldier living areas, such as barracks
- More than half of sexual assault cases involve alcohol use



SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION

- Avoid alcohol and other drugs
 - Intoxication associated increased risk of rape
 - Traditional beliefs on masculinity increased risk taking behaviors
- Rely on your instincts and be watchful
 - Warning signs of sexual harassment sexual assault
- Establish and maintain your limits
 - Define your values as a man/woman
 - Understand the ability to give consent
- Be able to act or intervene
