## Coronado High School Wins Nevada Regional Science Bowl Tournament

The Coronado High School team of Henderson, Nevada, marched through a 32-team, double-elimination tournament to win the U.S. Department of Energy's 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Nevada Regional Science Bowl. Held Saturday, February 26, on the campus of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas and Vegas PBS studios, the Coronado team claimed a trip to Washington D.C. to represent the region and a \$5,000 check for their school.

Placing second and winning a prize of \$2,500 for its school was Palo Verde High School of Las Vegas, Nevada.

Third place and a \$1,500 check went to Centennial High School "Blue" team of Las Vegas, Nevada. The Meadows School "Blue" team of Las Vegas, Nevada took fourth and won \$1,000 for their school. Other teams that placed in the tournament were:

<u>Fifth Place - \$500</u> The Meadows School "Green" team of Las Vegas, Nevada Douglas High School of Minden, Nevada

<u>Seventh Place \$300</u> Shadow Ridge High School of Las Vegas, Nevada Bishop Manogue High School of Reno, Nevada

<u>Ninth Place - \$100</u> Reno High School of Reno, Nevada Churchill County High School of Fallon, Nevada Carson High School of Carson City, Nevada Spanish Springs High School of Sparks, Nevada

Teams from Arizona, California, Nevada, and Utah participated in the day-long event. The team from Coronado High School will participate in the U.S. Department of Energy's National Science Bowl Competition, April 28 - May 2, 2011, in Washington D.C.
