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NSTEC DONATES LINENS TO TORNADO VICTIMS

LAS VEGAS, Nev. – National Security Technologies (NSTec), the management and operating contractor for the Nevada National Security Site (NNSS), is donating 21,450 pounds of bed linens, bath towels and wash cloths to the Missouri tornado victims.

The company recently subcontracted with a new linen provider for its 332 dormitory rooms that house personnel visiting the NNSS. With the new provider came new linens, creating the opportunity to donate the existing linens to the tornado victims.

The donation includes: 1,917 full sheets, 4,663 twin sheets, 11,365 pillow cases, 2,813 bath towels, 2,250 hand towels, 2,151 wash cloths, and 1,278 bath mats. The linens are all good-quality cotton-polyester blend or 100 percent cotton terry cloth.

Under Federal guidelines, contractors such as NSTec must make such donations through the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA). In this case, the San Francisco Office of the GSA made contact with the State of Missouri, which welcomed the donation. The donation, valued at \$23,512.80, will be shipped to Joplin, Mo., where it will be distributed to the hardest-hit areas.

On May 22, a tornado cut a path of destruction 14 miles long and up to a mile wide through southwest Missouri, seven miles of which was within the city limits of Joplin. More than 9,200 residents of Jasper and Newton counties have filed for federal assistance, and many are still living in shelters.

NSTec manages operations at the NNSS and its related facilities and laboratories for the National Nuclear Security Administration/Nevada Site Office.

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
