General George S. Brown Spouse Tuition Assistance Program (STAP)

The purpose of the Spouse Tuition Assistance Program (STAP) is to provide partial tuition assistance for spouses of Active Duty airmen or officers, who accompany members to overseas locations and will be attending college programs.

General Henry H. Arnold Education Grant Program

The General Henry H. Arnold Education Grant Program provides \$2000 grants to selected sons and daughters of active duty, Title 10 AGR/Reserve, Title 32 AGR performing full-time active duty, retired, retired reserve and deceased Air Force members; spouses (stateside) of active duty members and Title 10 AGR/Reservists; and surviving spouses of deceased personnel for their undergraduate studies.

Community Programs

Give Parents a Break

AFAS will pay the cost of having the CDC open once a month for families referred to the program

Bundles for Babies

Car Care Because We Care

This program is designed to keep the primary family vehicle of deployed members in top running condition by providing preventive vehicle maintenance

Child Care for PCS

AFAS will pay up to 20 hours of child care (per child) for families in the process of a PCS move

Respite Care

This program provides a "break" for families who have a family member with special needs

Spouse Employment Program

This program provides entry-level job training to spouses with the goal being immediate, viable employment

Child Care for Volunteers

AFAS provides funding for volunteers who are engaged in supporting programs which benefit the Air Force community

Youth Employment Skills (YES)

This program offers high school students an opportunity to learn valuable work skills, "bank" dollar credits toward their post-secondary education/training
