Introduction

1. The 2009 year was filled with activities and challenges for all personnel of the Canadian Detachment (CD) Elmendorf. Detachment members continued their involvement in the various aspects of Elmendorf AFB, along with many Canadian and American community events. This report contains information regarding the major contributions and activities of CD Elmendorf. This information is broken down into several main topics including Personnel, Promotions, Decorations and Awards, Military Activities and Courses, Social Activities, and a status report of Department of National Defence (DND) Property. You will also find attached Annex A, a Nominal Roll for CD Elmendorf that is current as of 31 December 2009.

<u>Personnel</u>

- 2. Members of the Detachment at Elmendorf Air Force Base, Alaska, were employed within seven areas: Alaskan NORAD Region (ANR) Headquarters, 962nd Airborne Air Control Squadron (962 AACS), 611 Air Operations Center (611 AOC), 611th Air Intelligence Squadron (611 AIS); 611th Air Support Group (611 ASG); 176th Air Control Squadron (176 ACS); and the Canadian Personnel Services Support Centre (CPSSC). Unit personnel consisted of 30 military personnel 20 Officers and 10 non-commissioned members. It also employed two civilian personnel; the ANR Deputy Commander Secretary, and the Canadian Community Program Coordinator (CCPC). In addition, the unit provides limited support to the four (4) Canadian NCMs attached to the 381st Intelligence Squadron (381st IS) at Elmendorf AFB.
- 3. All but one of the Detachment's members live in civilian housing, either in Anchorage or in the nearby Eagle River area. The Senior Canadian Officer being the only exception, as his position of Deputy Commander, Alaskan NORAD Region, requires designated on-base housing. Travel time to work is no more than 30 minutes for any member. The city of Anchorage is the metropolitan centre of Alaska, supporting an estimated population of 359,180 (U.S. Census Bureau, estimate for February 2009). It has all the institutions and facilities associated with a modern city, including universities, colleges, art galleries, concert halls and shopping malls. Services provided on the base include recreational support, fitness centres, medical and dental facilities, an education centre, day care, Base Exchange (shopping) and a Commissary (grocery).
- 4. The Detachment experienced a significant turnaround of staff this year. During APS 09, the CD Elmendorf saw ten families leave and nine new families join the community. Personnel movements were as follows:

15. On 11 November 2009, the Canadian and American militaries performed a combined Remembrance Day/Veterans Day Service at the Alaska National Guard Armory, Camp Denali at Fort Richardson. In keeping with the local tradition, at the conclusion of the indoor ceremony, the Canadian Detachment and members of the Anchorage community proceeded to the Fort Richardson National Cemetery, where eight of the Canadian airmen and four Canadian soldiers who died in the Aleutians Campaign during World War II are interred. At least 12 other Canadian airmen died in Alaska on operations during the Second World War and a further 11 Canadian Forces personnel have been killed while on duty in Alaska since 1945. These personnel are buried in Canada for the most part.

Social Activities

- 16. Despite the geographic distribution of Detachment members and the many varied challenges presented by living in Alaska, the unit maintains an active social calendar. The Maple Leaf Room (MLR), an all-ranks mess, is the centre for most functions. The MLR helps keep morale high and provides mutual support for the members and their families while away from Canada.
- 17. While the MLR is the primary venue for Canadian activities, the Detachment has access to numerous USAF facilities such as the various chalets on the base, the recreation camp at Seward, and the Elmendorf Officer's Club for social/recreational activities.
- 18. Hockey is a prominent sporting activity in Anchorage with the Detachment fielding two hockey teams. The first one, the Mirror Pond Moose Hockey Team, competes in a local Anchorage league at the "intermediate" level. The Mirror Moose Drool is the second hockey team. This team, which was created in 2007, plays at the "novice" level. Both Canadian Detachment teams participated in the Alaska Armed Forces Hockey Tournament between March 29 and 31, at their respective level. In fact, the tournament was organized and run by Captain J.J. Verran of the Canadian Detachment. The Mirror Pond team placed third overall in the Tier Two Division and the Moose Drool also finished third in their division. The team also participated in the Labatt Blue Pond Hockey Tournament in April finishing the round robin with a one and two record. In addition, the Officers and the NCMs compete in an annual hockey game against each other. This year, for the fourth year running, the officers were again victorious and defeated the NCMs by a score of 6 3.
- 19. Every year, the Detachment plans and hosts a Golf Tournament at Elmendorf AFB intended to promote the close ties that Canadians and Americans share. Sgt Greg Noel was the event organizer this year and oversaw another highly successful event. Capt Keith Morris represented the Detachment at the Canadian Forces Pacific Golf Regionals and was one of five golfers who advanced to the Nationals at CFB Shilo. Lastly, the 176th ACS fielded its own hockey team, the Spitfires, which several Detachment members playing alongside their American colleagues. Curling is the other sport of choice at the CD Elmendorf, many Canadians play in several leagues. A Canadian Team fielded by members of the CD Elmendorf competed against other U.S. military services and won the Top Rock Military Curling Bonspiel.

Whether aboard the ANR assigned E-3s, within the RAOC or AOC, the experiences gain creates a tremendous knowledge base to share/utilize/exploit by our personnel as they transition back to Canada and assimilate within our CF operations domestically and internationally.
