**SUMMARY**: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 54) of the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ") extending the target date for completion of the investigation by one month, from January 17, 2012 to February 17, 2012.

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION**: The Commission instituted this investigation on June 17, 2010, based on a complaint filed by HTC Corp. of Taiwan on May 12, 2010. 75 *Fed. Reg.* 34484 (June 17, 2010). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1337) in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain portable electronic devices and related software by reason of infringement of various claims of United States Patent Nos. 6,999,800; 5,541,988; 6,058,183; 6,320,957; and 7,716,505. The complaint named Apple Inc. of Cupertino, California as respondent.

On September 6, 2011, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 54) extending the target date for completion of the investigation by one month, from January 17, 2012 to February 17, 2012, and concomitantly moving the due date for issuance of the final ID from September 16, 2011 to October 17, 2011. None of the parties petitioned for review of the ID.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in section 210.42 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. § 210.42).
