By the way, when I was told of Mrs. Black's appointment last year, it was pointed out to me that there was no alternative because of the sizeable amount of money she had raised for the Nixon campaign during her travels in Europe. I could not possibly compete with her in this field. However, since the money issue was raised, I think you should know that during the last week of the campaign, when Humphrey was coming on strong, Bud Litton called me from New York and asked me if I could at once raise additional money to cover stepped-up TV exposure over the final weekend. The next day I brought to New York a client of mine and we handed \$60,000 to Maury Stans personally. I feel certain this sum or more will be available for the 1972 campaign.
