the reporter and the prof praised the experimental program. He is planning to go right into a 4-year college.

CBS had a report on 5 convicts, whose death sentences were commuted to life imprisonment by Arkansas' former Gov. Win. Rockefeller. The boys, now in reform school have attended junior college extension courses and all received Associate in Arts degrees. Rockefeller dropped by the graduation exercises to congratulate the boys and a college trustee stated that they were evidence that the body can be imprisoned but not the mind. And as long as the mind is free no man is a prisoner, he said to applause. One convict on film said he had gone to school to prove that he's not just a convict, but a person, too. He also wanted to help others avoid the mistakes he made.

JOHN F. KENNEDY CENTER

ABC's Virginia Sherwood gave us two and a half minutes of reportage on film of the new J.F.K. Center prior to its unofficial opening Thursday.
