his discovery of Al Hubbard's status. Actually we discovered
that he was not a captain but a sergeant and that he had never
been in Vietnam but had only flown in and our
cargo aircraft. We also found This was fed to several columnists and was used. It was also used on the Hill in some speeches which were covered and both NBC and CBS carried the story, NBC in particular on a morning news program had a long tearful apology by Hubbard who admitted he had lied.
