A. Competitive (Discretionary) Funds

- a. Agency submits application directly to HUD HQ
- c. Application is reviewed, rated and ranked
- d. Funding decision is made

- A. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

V. Eligible Activities

- A. Purpose Benefit low and moderate income persons.
- B. CDBG funds may be used for extensive list of eligible activities
 - -acquire real property
 - -relocation and demolition
 - -rehabilitation of residential and non
 - residential structures
 - -public facilities
 - -public services
 - -economic development



Eligible Activities (Cont'd)

- D. HOME funds may *only* be used to produce affordable housing for low-moderate income persons/families.
 - (1) homebuyer assistance
 - (2) rehabilitation for owner-occupants
 - (3) rental housing production
 - (4) tenant-based rental assistance (TBRA)



VI. Qualifying for State Formula Funding

A. CDBG

-City or County legal applicant

B. HOME

- -City or County legal applicant
- -CHDOs may apply for 15% set-aside

Affordable Housing in Your Communities

- C. Public Private partnerships:
 - a. Can city apply for HOME/CDBG funds on same project as County and CHDO?
 If you can, you greatly expand your individual capacity.



Affordable Housing in Your Communities

-City can access HOME funds to purchase land and engage in new construction, identifying CHDO as contractor

-County can access HOME funds to purchase land and engage in new construction, identifying CHDO as contractor

- -CHDO can apply for 15% set-aside funds
- -Non-profit can apply for RHED grant



Affordable Housing in Your Communities

- -City can apply for CDBG funds to put in infrastructure
- -County can apply for CDBG funds to put in infrastructure
- -Can a non-profit apply for and receive Housing Counseling funds to help people become more financially stable?
