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#### Italy returns F-16s; leased to support nation's interim air defense capability

S ix F-16s, brought out of retirement in 2003 to support a lease agreement with the Italian Ministry of Defense, were returned to 309 AMARG on June 24th

Under the "Peace Ceasar" foreign military sales program, F-16A and B-model fighters were leased by Italy to provide an interim air defense capability between the retirement of their Tornados and F-104 "Starfighters" until the Italian Air Force Service could fully achieve operations of the Eurofighter Typhoon.

Six more air frames are scheduled for a return delivery later this month.
