Marcy Carlson Speer 1959-2007




We are saddened to report the death of Dr. Marcy Speer from metastatic breast cancer on August 4, 2007. Marcy was a highly valued member of the VISN 6 MIRECC. Marcy served as a leader for the Genetics Core and was responsible for ensuring the success of the original award as well as scientifically guiding the project from its onset. Marcy was a genetic epidemiologist, a certified genetic counselor and a board-certified medical geneticist. She was the Director of the Duke Center for Human Genetics and a professor of Medicine and Chief of the Division of Medical Genetics in the Department of Medicine at Duke University Medical Center. She also held joint appointments as a professor in both the **Department of Biostatistics and Bioinformatics** and the Department of Molecular Genetics and Microbiology at Duke. Marcy worked on projects all over the world, and we appreciate that she chose as one of her projects to help veterans. Marcy is missed immensely. Our thoughts and prayers are with her husband, children and other family members as they grieve her loss.


Dr. Harold Kudler (Interim MIRECC Director) presented "DoD, VA, and Community Partnerships in Service to New Veterans and Their Families" at the National Association for Rural Mental Health 2007 Annual Conference and at for the VISN 2 Center for Integrated Health in August. Dr. Kudler repeated his presentation in September at the North Carolina National Guard Commanders' Conference and for the North Carolina Psychiatric Association.

In September, **Dr. Kristy Straits-Tröster** (Acting Co-Director, Clinical) presented "VA Strategies for Caring for Returning Veterans and their Families" in Bethesda, MD as part of a 2-week Psychology Training Workshop at the Center for Deployment Psychology at the Uniformed Services University of Health Sciences and Walter Reed Army Medical Center. Dr. Straits-Tröster also presented "Strategies in Serving New Combat Veterans and Their Families" for the Mental Health Association in North Carolina's Annual Meeting.

"Living in the New Normal: Supporting Children Through Trauma and Loss"



On August 8th NC First Lady Mary Easley launched the nation's first statewide implementation of this new initiative in collaboration with the Joint Forces of the North Carolina National Guard. This program was created by the **Military Child Education Coalition (MCEC)** to provide resources to help communities serve military families in times of transition, deployment, and loss. NC Governor Michael Easley hosted the kickoff at the Governor's Mansion to welcome experts and stakeholders attending the subsequent workshop. **MIRECC Clinical component** members were active participants in the full day public engagement effort to promote compassionate understanding of stressors related to the deployment of a parent or parents. The potential for community promotion of resilience through the establishment of a new normal was emphasized, including recognition of courage and identification of effective resources.
