This annual conference focuses on psychiatrists, psychologists, pharmacists, nurses, therapists and counselors, case managers, and others who worked in the public mental health system. The purpose is to provide information on the most recent therapeutic and medical approaches to the treatment of mental illness, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse. More than 75 mental health professionals and administrators attended the conference.



### Traumatic Brain Injury: *Reconnecting the Dots*

February 15, Asheville NC

**Robin Hurley, MD** (Associate Director, Education) and **Katherine Taber, PhD** (Assistant Director, Education) presented "**Mapping TBI from the Front to Communities**".

This full-day conference provided an overview of TBI across the lifespan, from shaken baby syndrome to falls among the elderly. Following the keynote address, the conference tracked the course of management from the acute, traumatic injury phase, through rehabilitation, to ongoing supports and resources needed from community mental health, allied health, and legal/public assistance providers.
