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Clinical Component Update



Harold Kudler, MD (MIRECC Associate Director, Clinical) presented a keynote address to over 400 community providers, leaders and stakeholders at the King County Veterans Community Training, which was held at the SeaTac Doubletree Hotel in Washington State on September 22 and 23. The King County Veterans Training Program featured a variety of workshops devoted providing services to Veterans returning from the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan and their families. Dr. Kudler focused on issues specific to the Reserve Component (National Guard and Reserve Members) and their families.

Among other speakers were Steve Hunt, MD (Director of the Deployment Mental Health Clinic, Puget Sound Health Care System), Thomas Schumacher (Director of Behavioral Health Programs for the Washington State Department of Veterans Affairs), Patricia Lester, MD (UCLA, Director of the FOCUS project in support of military families on bases across the nation), and Murray Raskind, MD (Director, Puget Sound Health Care System MIRECC). This meeting offered an important opportunity to share best practices in service to Veterans and their families across MIRECCs and across DoD/VA/State and Community Partnerships.

Dr. Hurley has accepted an invitation to serve on the Concussion/ Mild TBI Workgroup, tasked with developing recommendations about [1] the most appropriate items in Common Data Elements Version 1 for studies of this population and [2] any additional items required to fill critical gaps.

VA Mental Health and Chaplaincy Forum September 1-2 2011, Washington, DC



Healthcare leaders from around the country convened a few blocks northeast of the White House to attend this Forum. The meeting provided attendees with a unique opportunity to examine how chaplains, clergy, and other spiritual care providers might be optimally integrated into a public health model that better addresses the complex health needs of Veterans, Service members, and their families. The seventy eight attendees representing many different types of health care providers (chaplaincy, mental health, primary care) and organizations (VA, all branches of the military, various academic and community organizations) converged to provide input on existing programs and on how to take steps toward better integrating care for Service members and Veterans.

Group Supervision for Clinicians Listening to Trauma Histories

Therapists treating PTSD often find themselves in parallel turmoil, as they react to the patient's inner and outer worlds. Good clinical supervision is essential. In addition to receiving guidance and support from an experienced colleague, having the opportunity to share one's often turbulent emotions and learning how these can be used to better understand the case are also important.
