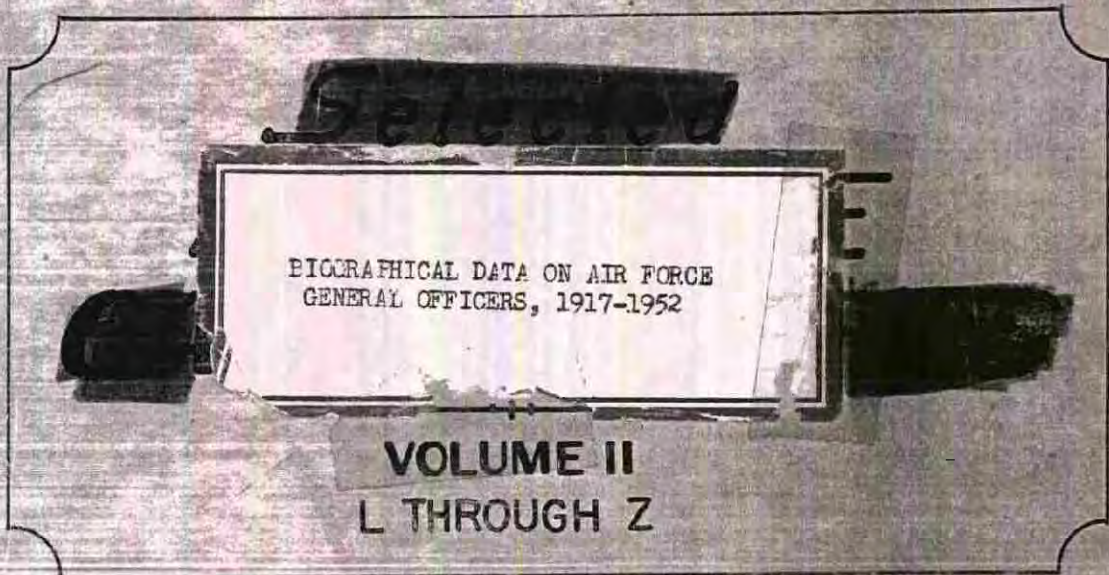

GENERAL CURTIS E. LeMAY, USAF.

Curtis E. LeMay was born in Columbus, Ohio, November 15, 1906. He was graduated from Ohio State University with a Bachelor of Engineering degree in June, 1928. The following October he was appointed a second lieutenant in the Regular Army, after completing flight training at Kelly Field, Texas.

His first tour of duty was with the 27th Pursuit Squadron at Selfridge Field, Michigan, and this was followed by such assignments as engineer, operations and intelligence officer and navigator-pilot and commander of a B-17 airplane. He also took a three-month course in navigation at Langley Field, Virginia, and was graduated from the Air Corps Tactical School at Maxwell Field, Alabama.

In 1937, General LeMay participated in the goodwill South American flight of B-17 Flying Fortresses, led by the late Major General Robert Olds. A second goodwill trip to South America, which he made the following year brought the entire group the Mackay Trophy. Just prior to the United States entry into World War II, he pioneered the ferry routes to Africa via South America and the South Atlantic and to England via the North Atlantic.

General LeMay then trained the 305th Bombardment Group, which he took to England in the fall of 1942. He introduced formation pattern bombing, where all aircraft drop their bombs in synchronization with a leader who provides all data on range and deflection. He also put into tactical use the combat formation utilizing 18 aircraft in each group. These same techniques were adapted to the B-29s of his 20th Bomber Command in the China-Burma-India theater.

In his final tour of duty with the Eighth Air Force, from June, 1943, to June, 1944, General LeMay was commanding general of the Third Bombardment Division. In August, 1943, he led the famous shuttle mission of Flying Fortresses from England to Africa, the first such made. (Target: Regensburg, Germany) He was transferred in August, 1944, to the China-Burma-India theater to head the 20th Bomber Command.

General LeMay was appointed commander of the Marianas-based B-29s (21st Bomber Command) in January, 1945. When this command was changed to the 20th Air Force, he continued to head it until he was assigned as chief of staff of the U.S. Army Strategic Air Forces, with headquarters at Guam. He continued in those duties until September, 1945, when he made a non-stop flight from Hokkaido, Japan, to Chicago, Illinois.

In October, 1945, General LeMay was assigned to Air Materiel Command headquarters at Wright-Patterson Field, Ohio, where he remained until December 5, 1945, when he was appointed Deputy Chief of Air Staff for Research and Development at Air Force headquarters in Washington.

MORE

General LeMay, on October 1, 1947, was named commanding general of the U.S. Air Forces in Europe. In October, 1948, he assumed command of Strategic Air Command at Andrews Air Force Base, Maryland, and the following month moved with SAC headquarters to Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska, retaining his position as commanding general.

General LeMay has been awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, Distinguished Service Medal with one Oak Leaf Cluster, Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross with one Cluster, and the Air Medal with three Clusters. His foreign decorations include the Brazilian Order of the Southern Cross; British Legion of Honor, and Belgian Croix de Guerre with Palm.

He is rated a command pilot, combat observer, aircraft observer and technical observer.

LIEUTENANT GENERAL CHARLES T. MYERS, USAF

Charles T. Myers was born in Mannington, West Virginia, on February 2, 1900. He entered the Virginia Military Institute in 1918, and the following year was appointed to the U. S. Military Academy, where he was a member of the varsity football teams in 1921 and 1922. He was graduated in 1923 with a Bachelor of Science degree, and commissioned a second lieutenant in the Regular Army.

General Myers entered flying school at Brooks Field, Texas, in September, 1923, winning his wings at Kelly Field, Texas, a year later. His first assignment as a pilot was at Brooks Field where he served as an instructor from September 1924 until the summer of 1929, when he was transferred to Nichols Field, Philippine Islands. For the next two years he was squadron officer of a bombardment outfit there.

On July 20, 1931, General Myers returned to Brooks Field and remained there three months before moving to Randolph Field, Texas, as an instructor, squadron engineering officer and squadron commander. His duty at Randolph Field ended in 1937, when he entered the Air Corps Tactical School at Maxwell Field, Alabama. In August 1938 after he completed the course at Maxwell Field, he was assigned to Miller Field, Staten Island, New York, as an instructor with the New York State National Guard.

In November, 1940, General Myers was assigned to Goodfellow Field, San Angelo, Texas, to direct training of Selective Service inductees. Shortly before Pearl Harbor he was transferred to Randolph Field as assistant chief of staff of the Flying Division and then became chief of the plans and training section of Central Flying Training Command. In December 1943 General Myers was placed in charge of the 77th Flying Training Wing at Foster Field (Victoria) Texas. A year later he was assigned to the 12th Air Force in Italy, where he was chief of staff and subsequently commanding general of the theater air force.

In December 1945 General Myers was appointed chief of staff, 33rd Flying Training Wing at Randolph Field, and in February 1946 was made commanding general. In April 1946 he was appointed deputy commander of Flying Training Command and then redesignated the Flying Division of Air Training Command. In March 1947 he took on additional duties as chief of staff of the Flying Division.

In May 1947 General Myers was assigned as chief of staff, Far East Air Materiel Command at Fuchu, Japan. In October of that year he assumed command of the 316th Bombardment Wing, Kadena AFB, Okinawa. The following summer he was appointed commanding general, First Air Division, Far East Air Forces. In December 1948, the 13th Air Force replaced the First Division and General Myers remained as commander of the 13th. In May 1949 he was named vice commander, Continental Air Command, Mitchel AFB, New York.

MORE

On January 1, 1951, Air Defense Command was reactivated at Ent Air Force Base, Colorado Springs, Colorado, and General Myers was appointed its vice commander. In February 1952 he was named Commander-in-Chief of the U. S. Northeast Command and commanding general of the Northeast Air Command, with station at Pepperell Air Force Base, Newfoundland.

Moving to Scott Air Force Base, Illinois, on July 26, 1954, General Myers assumed command of the Air Training Command.

General Myers has been awarded the Legion of Merit with one Oak Leaf Cluster, Bronze Star Medal, Air Medal and French Legion of Honor.

He is rated a command pilot, combat observer and aircraft observer.
