The summer is here and the heat is on! Not only are the temperatures outside rising, but as our compliance inspection draws near, we are turning up the heat on our preparation. Now is the time to make sure your work area is in tip-top shape and ready for the inspection. There are a number of things you can do to ensure you are ready. The following are things you can do TODAY to help prepare for the compliance inspection:

- Always have positive control of your CAC card. Do not leave it in your computer where others may use it to access your systems
- Ensure you are using the Privacy Act statements on emails containing Personally Identifying Information and that you are properly storing PII to protect people's identities
- Always use a Privacy Act cover sheet (blue or white paper) to cover any printed copies of info containing PII
- Properly dispose of PII when finished with it by shredding and not storing in your office for
- Always keep safety in mind and utilize the operational risk management tool to ACT--Assess the environment, Consider the options, and Take action
- Check with your unit deployment manager to ensure your mobility records are up to date and contain all required information
- Always remember OPSEC when communicating and storing information and remember that the aggregation of data can pose a risk when bits of unclassified data are pieced together to paint a classified picture

Remember, the CI will be the report card for the Wing on how well we are managing our processes and accomplishing our mission. An electronic snapshot of our processes will be taken in August, so maximize this UTA to clean it up. We want to ensure our record speaks to what we already know, the Airman at the 440th are the best around and are doing a bang-up job here at Pope Field!

Attitude is everything! Having a positive attitude going in to the inspection will be what sets us apart from our counterparts and will continue to make the 440<sup>th</sup> the best!

SAFETY is always a paramount concern this time of year. We are in the middle of the 101 critical days of summer, so please be mindful of using the ACT ORM principles listed above, even in your off-duty time to be safe while spending time doing recreational events with your family and friends. Everything from wearing sun block and hydrating to wearing your helmet while operating a bicycle or motorcycle are all steps we must take to ensure we protect ourselves and the ones we love.

A special note to motorcycle drivers and riders and their families; we are experiencing a high level of fatal accidents involving motorcycles this year. There has been an average of two motorcycle fatalities a month! These families are not losing their loved ones in a war zone, but rather are losing them while here at home. Motorcycles are inherently unsafe. You may be the best rider around, but it's the other drivers and the environment that that increase the risk exponentially. ACT ACT ACT


