I am writing to invite the Project on Government Oversight (POGO) to submit written testimony to the Subcommittee on Contracting Oversight for a hearing entitled, "Contractors: How Much Are They Costing the Government?" The hearing will be held on Tuesday, March 13, 2012 at 10:30 A.M. in Room SD-342 of the Dirksen Senate Office Building.

The purpose of the hearing is to examine whether government agencies use cost information to determine if work should be performed by federal employees or contractors. The hearing will also assess what the government is doing to improve the data available on contractors and develop best practices to determine when using contractors will constitute the most effective use of taxpayer dollars. In addition, the hearing will examine how government agencies can control the costs of contracting while still maintaining effective contract management and oversight.

POGO's recent study on the costs of contracting, "Bad Business: Billions of Taxpayer Dollars Wasted on Hiring Contractors," is the first to compare the costs of contractors with the costs of federal employees and the private sector. I invite you to submit testimony that discusses your work in this area and any challenges that you encountered with available contractor data. I would also appreciate any suggestions you may have as to how the government can do a better job in this area going forward.
