Marshall J. Doke, Jr., is a partner in the Dallas office of Gardere Wynne Sewell LLP. He was graduated with high honors from the Southern Methodist University School of Law where he was Editor in Chief of the *Southwestern Law Journal*.

Mr. Doke also was appointed in 2007 to a three-year term on the U.S. Court of Federal Claims Advisory Council.

Mr. Doke is a past President of the U.S. Court of Federal Claims Bar Association, a former Chairman of the American Bar Association’s Section of Public Contract Law, served as the Section’s Delegate to the ABA House of Delegates for over thirty years, and is a past President of the Boards of Contract Appeals Bar Association. He previously served on the ABA’s Board of Governors, as Co-Chairman of the ABA’s National Conference of Lawyers and Certified Public Accountants, and as Chairman of the ABA Conference of Section and Division Delegates. He also served on the Board of Governors of the Federal Circuit Bar Association and as President and Director of the American Bar Retirement Association.
