Mr. Campbell recently joined the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller) as the Director for Operations. In this position, he has oversight of and budget policy development for all operation and maintenance accounts within the Department of Defense. He also managed the development of supplemental requests for operations in Bosnia and Kosovo.

Mr. Campbell's career with the Army included numerous positions within the Army Budget Office. He returned to the Army Budget Office in 2003 as the Deputy Director of the Army Budget. Most recently, Mr. Campbell was the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Budget. He oversaw the development and execution of all Army appropriations over the last six years.
