We are writing to invite you to testify before the Subcommittee on Contracting Oversight at a hearing entitled, "Whistleblower Protections for Government Contractors." The hearing will be held on Tuesday, December 6, 2011 at 10:00 A.M. in Room SD-342 of the Dirksen Senate Office Building.

The purpose of the hearing is to review the "Non-Federal Employee Whistleblower Protection Act," a bill that was introduced by Senator McCaskill to bolster whistleblower protections for government contractors and other non-federal employees. This will allow adequate time for you to engage in questions and answers with members of the Subcommittee. Subcommittee rules require that your testimony be submitted by no later than 10:00 A.M. on Friday, December 2, 2011.
