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Albany Researcher Gordon Holcomb Receives Engineer of the Year Award

The National Energy Technology Laboratory is proud to announce that Albany resident Gordon Holcomb has received the 2011 Don Waters Engineer of the Year award from the Western Area of the National Association of Corrosion Engineers (NACE).

NACE International makes the annual award in recognition of outstanding technical contributions to the field of corrosion engineering and science. Dr. Holcomb was honored for his research on corrosion control for steel-reinforced concrete bridges—including the Yaquina Bay Bridge in Newport, Ore., the Richmond-San Rafael

Bridge on the San Francisco Bay, and the Perley Bridge in Ontario, Canada—as well for materials used in natural gas pipelines and coal-fired power plants retrofitted to capture carbon dioxide in response to climate change.

Dr. Holcomb is a materials engineer with NETL's Materials Performance Division. He joined the U.S Bureau of Mines, which later became the Albany Research Center and is now NETL, in 1988.
